**Sheriff's Office  
 Receives 193  
 Reports in April**

A total of 193 complaints were received by the Jackson county sheriff's office during April, according to the department's monthly report.

Of the complaints, 25 were for felonies, 64 were listed as misdemeanors, with the remaining 104 complaints listed as miscellaneous. The miscellaneous include routine checks for outside departments, live-stock complaints, lost property, and missing persons.

One hundred forty-eight complaints were closed during the month by the department.

A breakdown of the felony complaints shows 8 cases of larceny, 7 burglary, 4 fictitious checks, 2 narcotics, and one each of robbery, rape, assault with a deadly weapon, and fraud. Leading the misdemeanor complaints, 20, followed by disorderly conduct, 10, and 7 for malicious mischief. Others in this category were drunk, road violations and traffic accidents.

The department served 10 warrants during the month and 260 civil papers. Ninety-four persons were lodged in the county jail.

The number of complaints received during April is the highest received during the last six years. For the same month last year 189 complaints were received.

**The Medical Roundup**

 The Human Betterment Association of America now has a list of 800 physicians willing to perform sterilizing operations on both men and women when the health of a wife becomes so frail that expert obstetricians say that the completion of another child would probably result in her death.

Men have been writing me to say that because of their wife's tuberculosis, or mental depression, or serious Bright's disease, or heart disease, several physicians have advised strongly against her ever having another child. But when my correspondents wanted to have their cords tied, they could not find a physician who would perform the little harmless operation. These men might now write to Mrs. Smith, at the Human Betterment Association, 105 W. 55th St., New York 19, N. Y., to see if she can tell them of a physician in their city who will do this work. The Association also has booklets available. I can easily understand why the physicians consulted refused to take the case. With the present craze for suing doctors, all the man operated on would have to do in order to get himself perhaps \$50,000 would be to tell a sympathetic jury that he thought the operation had made him anxious and depressed and demoralized. The way things are going in courts today, the fact that a hundred thousand men have had a vasectomy without feeling any discomfort, might not influence the jury in making their decision.

**Problems of a Diabetic Mother**

I was just reading two articles by Drs. A. Dekaban and R. Baird, of St. Louis, which show that still, after 40 years of the use of insulin, the diabetic mother and her child face great dangers. Forty-eight diabetic mothers, who had 157 pregnancies, suffered an abortion in 29.9 per cent of their pregnancies; a still birth in 11.5 per cent and a premature birth in 8.3 per cent. They had a surviving abnormal child in 3.8 per cent, and a surviving normal child in 46.5 per cent. Among a "control" group of non-diabetic women, there was only one surviving abnormal child (0.4 per cent) and 82.3 per cent of normal surviving children. Today, many obstetricians like to take the child by cesarean section four weeks early. This tends to save the life of the infant.

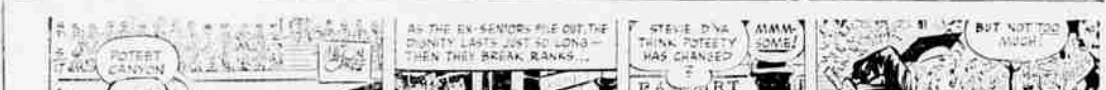
