**When a Child Gets the Bed**

I wish I could tell thousands of troubled parents what to do that would surely stop their child from wetting the bed. Each year I read a dozen or more learned articles on the subject, but seldom do I learn anything helpful.

I have long known that the tendency is commonly inherited. I found it in 5 per cent of a group of 574 people I saw who came of families in which there was psychosis and alcoholism.

Some of the mothers of bed-wetting children told me that their child was clumsy and had poor control over his muscles. Others told me that there were stutters in their immediate family, and others said their child who wet the bed had tic or convulsive motions of his face and shoulders.

In one of my families there were three young women, all of whom wet the bed until they were almost 20. They had a number of psychotic and problem relatives. Interesting was a woman patient of mine who, at 45, was still occasionally wetting the bed. Her two children over the age of seven were still wetting the bed. The mother had epileptic electroencephalograms and a brother was alcoholic and epileptic.

**Related To Epileptics**

I saw eight bed-wetters who were related closely to epileptics. When, a few years ago, I tried to tell people that we doctors should be studying such cases to see what the re-
