## Armed Forces Day To Be Observed at Kingsley Saturday

A decade has passed since the first Armed Forces Day celebration in 1950. That year the secretary of defense, with the approval of the President, gave official recognition to a one-day unified observance of the military plays in keeping the peace. The 1950 slogan was "Teamed for Defense."

The 1953 slogan proclaimed "Power for Peace." This phrase became so descriptive of the national effort that it has remained.

**Emphasizes Concept**

The 1960 observance emphasizes the concept that the Free World, to which the Armed Forces are committed, is the real Power for Peace.

## Soviet Engineer Asks Scotland for Political Asylum

Edinburgh, Scotland—(UPI)—A member of a Russian cultural delegation asked British police for political asylum today.

Reliable government sources identified the Russian as Anatoly Nakashidze, 28, an engineer and industrial manager from Soviet Georgia.

Nakashidze, a member of a Soviet miners' delegation touring Scotland under a cultural exchange agreement, walked into an Edinburgh police station with his request, the sources said.

He was reported taken to Saughton Prison pending a decision from London on granting asylum.

**Family in Georgia**

The Russian is married and has a 6-month-old daughter, the sources said. His mother and two sisters live in Georgia.

The rest of the 30-member delegation of Soviet musicians and dancers discovered Nakashidze was missing when they checked out of a hotel prior to flying to London this morning.

Sources said Nakashidze was reported to have made contact with several refugee Russians while in Edinburgh.

The Soviet delegation has been guests of the Scottish National Union of Miners. The group was spending two days here before returning to Russia.

## Corvallis Firm Has Order Upheld

Salem—(UPI)—Marion Circuit Judge Val D. Sloper Tuesday upheld a Public Utility Commission order of last year curtailing operations of State Transport Company of Corvallis.

The Corvallis firm took over a permit formerly issued to William Meyer. In approving the transfer the PUC restricted the operations area of the firm and types of cargo. This action was appealed by the company.

## Chou Supports Nikita's Actions

Tokyo—(UPI)—Communist Chinese Premier Chou En-lai said today his country "firmly supported" Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev's actions in Paris and joined the Russians in accusing the United States of "sabotaging" the summit.

Chou, speaking in Peiping at a banquet honoring a visiting Algerian provisional government delegation, accused the United States of "attempting to shift its responsibility for sabotaging the conference onto the Soviet Union."

"This is indeed shameful in the extreme," the New China News Agency quoted him as saying.

The Communist leader also accused the United States of "creating all sorts of difficulties and obstacles for the conference and continually spreading the pessimistic line that the conference was doomed to failure."

New York—(UPI)—Georgia Harvey, 85, a character actress whose Broadway career spanned more than half a century, died Wednesday.

## New Presbyterian Moderator Working For Desegregation

Cleveland, Ohio—(UPI)—The Rev. Herman Lee Turner, newly-elected moderator of the United Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A., today began working toward desegregation.

The Rev. Turner, 69, of Atlanta, Ga., was elected presiding officer of the church in a close vote Wednesday. He defeated the Rev. Edler V. Hawkins, Negro pastor of St. Augustine Church, New York, by two votes, 471-469.

**Sees Achievement**

The new moderator said he believes desegregation will be achieved by "steady pressure." The majority of the urban residents are ready to accept desegregation, he said, "but the rural areas are too strongly opposed—resisting any change."

He said he believes in obeying the law of the land. "I am not secure until my neighbor is secure, has the same rights as I have," he said.

**Gained Wide Renown**

The Rev. Turner has been minister of the Atlanta congregation for 30 years. He is also head of the Atlanta Christian Council and a past president of the Georgia Council of Churches.

The new moderator gained wide renown as author of the "Atlanta Manifesto," that condemned racial hatred and pleaded for the maintenance

## Japanese Police Seek Kidnap-Killer

Tokyo—(UPI)—Police ordered a nation-wide search today for a Tokyo dentist suspected of kidnaping and killing the son of a wealthy merchant because he "couldn't wait" for the ransom payoff.

Authorities identified the suspect as Shigehisa Motoyama, 32, in whose abandoned automobile the body of Masaki Ozeki, 7, was found this morning. The youth disappeared three days ago while en route to an exclusive primary school.

Police said that Motoyama was an acquaintance of the parents of the slain lad.

Police first said the boy apparently had been strangled by an impatient kidnaper who had telephoned the terrified parents he "could not wait" for the ransom amounting to a little more than \$8,300.
