Local Residents to Vote on Annexation

Registered voters in Medford will vote on two measures on the city ballot and three measures on the county ballot in tomorrow's primary election. Both of the measures on the city ballot are proposed charter amendments annexing territory completely surrounded by the city. They are numbered No. 31 and No. 52.

No. 31 is a 46-acre tract containing some 171 persons situated north of McAndrews rd., east of Riverside ave., east and south of Crater Lake highway and west of Biddle rd.

No. 52 is a nine-acre tract containing some eight persons situated east of Barnburg rd., south of Oregon ave., west of Sunrise ave., and north of Jackson st.

In many cases there is only one, and in some cases no candidates listed on the primary ballots. Write-in candidates, officials noted, are counted, and space is provided for a write-in vote in each office for which a candidate will be named.

Cooperation Needed Between AEC, NASA

Los Angeles, Science Service - U. S. leadership in the conquest of space depends upon the close cooperation of the Atomic Energy Commission and the National Aeronautic and Space Administration, a former AEC Commissioner charges.

Dr. Willard F. Libby of the University of California here said that AEC and NASA, working together, can keep the U. S. ahead in space exploration by maintaining a strong educational program to provide adequate numbers of scientists and engineers trained in applications of atomic energy to space.

The development of a rocket engine with a million-pound thrust, Dr. Libby said, is whether the next generation of engineers and scientists will be "interested in space."

Drugs' Affect on White Cells Told

New York, Science Service - Because several of the wonder drugs, especially sulfa, can dangerously reduce the white blood cell count, New York University's biological laboratories have developed a new simple technique to reveal such dangers in prospective drugs.

The new method first exposes rats to a sub-lethal dose of x-radiation. This dose reduces the white cell count. The drug is then given to some of the sensitized animals, while other exposed rats are kept as controls. If the drug does have the potential of reducing the white cell count, the blood of animals both injected and radiated regains its normal count more slowly than the blood of the rats that underwent radiation only.

Rain Proves Aid To Duck Breeding

Victoria, Australia, Science Service - Nomadic wild ducks inhabiting the arid interior of Australia breed only when sporadic rains fill the dry creek beds and backwaters or cause a sharp rise in water level in running streams. H. J. Frith of Australia's Wildlife Survey Section has found. When breeding is finished and the water evaporates, the duck population moves elsewhere. The inland rains are rarely seasonal and floods or heavy rains at any time of the year initiate breeding.

Early-Cut Silage Ups Cows' Output

Ithaca, N. Y., Science Service - Dairy men can save millions each year by feeding their cattle early-cut silage instead of late-cut field-cured hay, two researchers here report. New York state alone should have more than \$50 million by using this kind of feed.


Prof. S. T. Slack and Keith Kennedy of the New York State College of Agriculture at Cornell university found in three years of experiment that cows produce an average of 16 pounds more milk a day if fed the early-cut silage diet.

Their experiments were carried out on purebred Holstein and Brown Swiss cows. Cows fed the early-cut silage gave slightly more than 50 pounds of milk a day. Those fed early-cut barn-dried hay produced 44 pounds and those on the late-cut field-cured hay died produced less than 33 pounds daily.

Agricultural specialists are not sure why the early-cut feed gives better results. However, they believe that the acids formed in the silage as it develops may aid the cow's digestive processes and enable it to produce more milk. The acids in the silage are similar to those in a cow's digestive tract.
