### Humphrey Taking Neutral Position

Washington - (UPI) - Sen. Hubert H. Humphrey (D-Minn.), no longer a candidate himself, is taking a neutral position for the time being toward other Democratic presidential contenders.

Humphrey's political associates said today he was not ready to offer any advice to delegates who were prepared to support him for the nomination at the Democratic convention in July.

The Minnesota senator had expected to go to the convention with 175 to 200 delegate votes before he pulled out of the race last week. He withdrew after taking a bad beating from Sen. John F. Kennedy (D-Mass.) in the West Virginia primary.

Humphrey left here Wednesday to attend the Minnesota Democratic state convention, which will open Friday and complete selection of a 31-vote delegation to the national convention.

### Quotes From the News

**BY UNITED PRESS INTERNATIONAL**

Paris - Soviet Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev, explaining at a news conference why he refused to negotiate unless the United States apologized for the U-2 "spy" flight, promised it would not be repeated, and punished those responsible.

"Wouldn't it be better . . . to take the American aggressors by the scuff of the neck and give them a little shaking and make them understand they must not commit such acts of aggression against the Soviet Union?"

Paris - President Eisenhower, in an airport statement before leaving Paris for Lisbon:

"I share the disappointment of my colleagues that because of our inability to convene the summit conference, we could make no progress toward easing the tensions that so plague mankind."

Washington - Acting White House press secretary Wayne Hawks, stating that inquiries were coming in from officials and citizens asking how they can show their support for President Eisenhower when he returns:

"We'll be glad to have them at the airport."

Washington - Rep. Steven B. Derouian (R-N.Y.), dismissing Thomas (The Cork) Corcoran's offer to submit a legal brief to an investigating subcommittee proving he had a right to talk to federal power commissioners about a case:

"You can get briefs on almost anything these days—they are like statistics."

### Klamath Doctor Drowns in River

Klamath Falls - (UPI) - Dr. Hugh M. Swaney, 49, a well-known Klamath Falls physician and surgeon, drowned while fishing with two companions near Keno Wednesday.

Companions Bob Wilson and Dick Taylor said Swaney apparently lost his balance in a high wind which was blowing at the time and slid down a bank into 20 feet of water in the Klamath river.

The two men managed to get his body from the water and applied artificial respiration, but it was too late.

Surviving are his widow, Madeline; a son, Hugh; a daughter, Jane; and his mother, who lives in California.

### Dr. Petersen Speaks At Corvallis Event

Ashland - Dr. Alexander Petersen, chairman of the Southern Oregon college physical education and health department, was guest speaker for the annual senior banquet of the Oregon State college Association for Health, Physical Education and Recreation Wednesday in Corvallis. His topic was "Professionalism."

An organizer and charter member of the original men's physical education club on the OSC campus, prior to his promotion in 1949, Dr. Petersen has since been named as an "all-time great" because of his undergraduate performance on the basketball teams of that era.

Samuel Hearne, first white man to reach the Arctic overland from Hudson Bay, was 47 at his death in England in 1792.

### Welcome Planned For Eisenhower

Washington - (UPI) - Plans were shaping up slowly today for a big bipartisan welcome for President Eisenhower Friday when he returns home from the scuttled summit conference.

Democratic leaders, already on the record with declarations of support for the President to counter Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev's attacks on him, were waiting to hear more about the reception arrangements.

Senate Democratic Leader Lyndon B. Johnson (Texas) and some others whose names might add bipartisan luster to the occasion did not expect to be in Washington Friday.

But there was every likelihood that the Democrats in Congress would be represented to some extent in the Eisenhower welcome at Andrews Air Force Base.

Senate GOP Leader Everett M. Dirksen (Ill.) said he would have more details on the welcome worked out today.

### 80-Year-Old Man Gets Birthday Bike

Kelleys Island, Ohio - Nelson Dwellie was given a bike for his birthday. He is 80 years old.

Dwellie, a retired fisherman, is in charge of posting the weather flags on this small Lake Erie island. His neighbors chipped in for the bike and presented it at a party.

Dwellie said it is the first new bike he's ever owned. Most of the time he makes his four miles daily round trip on one borrowed from one of his grandchildren.

### Tiny Foreign Cars Cut Park Problems

New York - (UPI) - The small foreign car and the compact American car may help solve a part of the parking problem in major U.S. cities.

This was the opinion of more than half of the municipal officials who responded to a survey conducted by the makers of a Japanese auto (Datsun).

Of the 200 largest cities in the country queried, 94 responded.

Sixty-nine cities reported it has become difficult or nearly impossible for an average shopper to find parking space in a downtown area.

Fifty-one said that the increased size of standard model cars contributed substantially to the difficult situation.

Suggestions for alleviating the parking problem included: elimination of on-street parking, the building of additional off-street parking facilities, establishment of one-way streets, increased turning radius at intersections and synchronized signals.

The survey indicated that most experts believed the parking problem can be lessened with positive planning.

### Area Students Are Named to Society

Corvallis - Kenneth R. Arnold, a junior in engineering from Medford, and Sally J. Elden, a junior in education from Central Point, have won top recognition for outstanding scholarship at Oregon State college by being picked for membership in Phi Kappa Phi, national scholastic honor society.

To qualify for membership in this honor group, juniors must rank in the upper 5 per cent of their class and seniors and graduate students in the upper 10 per cent. The new

members of the honor group were introduced at the all-school campus and awards program.

### Tourists Cancel Trips To Russia

New York - (UPI) - Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev's summit blow-up has caused "some, but not many" American tourists to cancel summer trips to Eastern Europe and Russia, a quick survey of travel agencies showed today.

Marvin Deutsch, managing editor of the trade publication Travel Weekly, said his quick check showed agencies were receiving numerous inquiries but that most travelers were apparently taking a "wait and see attitude."

Some agents are advising clients to cancel their trips, either because they believe Americans may be subjected to uncomfortable hostility or because they feel that "if Ike's not good enough for them, it might be rough for an ordinary tourist." The American Tourist Bureau, a "wholesale" agency which handles arrangements with Russia's Intourist and others for other agencies, said it was felt that "if they don't want President Eisenhower, why should we give them \$10 million in tourist money?"
