### The Medical Roundup

Of What Does A Good Medical Check-up Consist?

Naturally, the check-up of a person past the age of 40 must be much more thorough than that of a healthy-looking and active young person. Faced by a person past middle age, the physician must try to rule out the degenerative diseases in arteries, heart, brain and kidneys, plus cancer. Un fortunately, only a few physicians are prepared to make a satisfactory and adequate examination.

Many, in their busy day, cannot give enough time; many are too specialized, and some are not specialized enough. Very few have an adequate laboratory, and few have a good x-ray department. As a result, many a person who goes for a thorough check-up just does not get it.

Today, many of the new laboratory tests on blood are so difficult that only an able chemist can perform them accurately. But, in addition, in a clinical laboratory, there should be persons skilled in studying blood, in recognizing intestinal parasites, in identifying bacteria in the urine, sputum, etc; in performing the tests for syphilis, in measuring the basal metabolic rate (test of function of the thyroid gland) and perhaps in making electrocardiograms.

Obviously, then, an ideal thorough examination can be given only by a group of special experts such as can be found in a big hospital, or university, or private clinic, where enough patients come each day to give an adequate income to a number of men and women, each with a great and special skill.

But even when a big business man goes to a great clinic for his check-up he will be annoyed if the examination takes four or five days or more. Often when a huge corporation goes to a great clinic and tries to arrange for the yearly examination of their executives the clinic authorities say they would prefer not to attempt such a scheme. They say "Your busy men want to fly in the morning, and leave that night, with the job done. We can't dislocate our schedule in order to oblige your men." Because of this situation, some years ago one of America's big corporations set up its own little clinic in which employees are examined—in one day. How do they do it? Something like this.

The evening before, if the man wants his gallbladder x-rayed, he takes a certain drug that makes the organ visible. Or he may take a dose of castor oil to empty his colon for its x-ray examination. Next morning, early, he goes, fasting, to the clinic.

There, he gets much blood taken for 1) a test for syphilis; 2) an estimation of hemoglobin (the red coloring matter of the blood) to rule out anemia; 3) a red blood sedimentation rate, which, if low, will tend to rule out any decided ill health, a smouldering infection, or a scattering cancer; 4) a differential blood count, to rule out serious blood diseases such as leukemia; 5) then estimates of sugar, to rule out diabetes; 6) cholesterol, to throw some light on a tendency in hardening of the arteries; 7) uric acid, to rule out gout; 8) creatinine, to
