## Whirlpool Bath Introduced in Area

The Jacuzzi whirlpool bath is being introduced to the Medford area by Jacuzzi Whirlpool Bath of Southern Oregon, Ashland. Don Basey has announced.

The Jacuzzi, which weighs 25 pounds, is the first portable whirlpool equipment that can be used in any bath tub or swimming pool.

Company officials state that Jacuzzi has a number of medical and non-medical values. Whirlpool massage is often prescribed by doctors for relief of minor pain associated with arthritis or rheumatism, for post-polio patients, and cerebral palsy victims. From the non-medical standpoint, the Jacuzzi is frequently recommended for relaxation, to help combat sleeplessness, and is said to aid those on reducing diets.

## Nixon Encouraged By Poll Results

Washington - (UPI) - Vice President Richard M. Nixon is "very encouraged" by college and public school polls and mock political tests which give him an edge in the presidential election race over Democratic opponents, a spokesman said Saturday.

The Nixon camp reported that it now has 214 Nixon-for-President clubs on college campuses from New Hampshire to California.

Herbert G. Klein, Nixon's press secretary, said the list of polls and other student samplings was by no means complete but did offer a "cross-section" of youth interest.

In the Nixon list of college polls, Nixon won 10 to one over Democratic presidential prospects. He came out eight to one on a list of mock college political conventions, and 12 to five on another list of mock college political elections, Klein said.

Sen. John F. Kennedy (Mass.) winner in Friday's Oregon Democratic primary was the Democrat most mentioned in these tests.

In a national poll of 965,492 grade and high school students, Klein said, Nixon got 441,902 votes to 324,005 for Kennedy, 56,626 for Adlai E. Stevenson and 52,812 for Sen. E. Democratic Leader Lyndon B. Johnson. Sen. Hubert H. Humphrey (D-Minn.) won 46,093 and Sen. Stuart Symington (D-Mo.) 31,137.

"The vice president is very encouraged by the interest shown by young people in his campaign and in the Republican party because, for a long time, he has been greatly concerned about the effect of Republicans to stimulate interest among our youth," Klein said.

## U.S. Maps Strategy for U.N.

Washington - (UPI) - America's strategy against Russian charges of aggression before the United Nations was worked out Saturday and U. N. Ambassador Henry Cabot Lodge said it will show the fallacy of the Soviet accusations.

The U.S. answer, to be delivered by Lodge in the U. N. Security council Monday, was completed by Secretary of State Christian A. Herter, Central Intelligence Chief Allen W. Dulles, Lodge and other top officials in an extraordinary Saturday conference.

It carried the full approval of President Eisenhower who was spending a weekend of rest in his Gettysburg farm.

Herter called the officials together almost immediately after he arrived here earlier Saturday from the Paris summit conference which was wrecked by Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev's insults to Eisenhower and his violent charges and demands over the U.S. spy plane incident.
