Ashland — Conference reports have been received for April from three college department representatives. Hugh G. Simpson, director of information at Southern Oregon college, has announced. Dr. Frank D. Haines, associate professor of social science, one of three delegates to represent SOC at the Pacific Northwest Conference at Seattle, was elected to the executive committee and appointed chairman of the program for next year's meeting. Other representatives included Rick Pastega, SOC student, Klamath Falls, and the late Dr. Verne Blue, of the social science division.

Eugene was the setting for the 18th Annual Conference of the Oregon Library Association. Miss Myrtle Funkhouser, librarian, Mrs. Eleanor S. Everett, Miss Lucy Anne Poucher, and Thornton T. Shively represented SOC at the meeting, at which Mrs. Robert Thornton, chairman of National Library Week in Oregon presented the details of the Ashland program with public and college library cooperating, as an example of a successful community program.

Wilda, associate professor of art, who represented Southern Oregon college at the Pacific Arts Association at Arizona State university, Tempe, Ariz., reported that the findings of the conference generally brought forth the feeling that art education and art generally need to take a good look at themselves; that for a number of years this area has exhibited little more than self satisfaction with its values and self assurance with its aims.

### Charges Against Fighters Dropped

Assault and battery charges have been dropped against three Ashland men involved in a fight with two Southern Oregon college students, District Attorney Thomas J. Reeder said Saturday.

Reeder said the charges were dropped with the consent of the two students, Mark M. Musgrave and John H. Heitsmith. The three Ashland men involved in the fight Feb. 6 in front of a cafe on Main St. in Ashland were Eldon Fagan, Eugene Rashe and Joe Roberts. They had entered pleas of innocent and a trial was pending.

"Thorough investigation revealed that the Heitsmith boy had begun the fight by asking the Ashland men outside," the district attorney said. "It also appeared that if Heitsmith hadn't gone to the car and gotten a club the fight would have ended a long time ago. I think everybody except perhaps Musgrave was at fault."

Musgrave did not appear to be out of line, Reeder added. While the fight was serious it was not a "gang affair," the district attorney added. During the fight, Heitsmith's nose was fractured and Musgrave's jaw was broken.
