

# Stock List Extends Monday's Setback In Routine Trading

New York — Stocks extended Monday's mild setback in generally routine trading today.

Electronics again countered the general downturn with gains of more than 4 in Texas Instruments and around 2 in Zenith and International Business Machines. Motorola, which has developed an almost completely transistorized portable TV receiver, rose more than a point.

The lowest steel operating rate since mid-September, 1958, brought leading steel under pressure. U.S. Steel fell around a point and Bethlehem a small fraction.

Motors improved by fractions. Lockheed lost more than a point in the aircrafts. Du Pont fell around 1 1/2 in the chemicals, while General Instrument added around 1 in its group.

## Snake Bite Victim Making Progress

Los Angeles — (AP) — Kenneth Earnest, 22, bitten eight days ago by the world's deadliest snake, was reported making "wonderful" progress toward recovery today in General Hospital.

Given only a 1-in-3 chance of living when admitted to the hospital last week, Earnest now can look forward to the day when medical treatment may restore him to near normal, according to doctors.

Even after Earnest began recovering it was feared he might have to spend his life in an iron lung because venom from the Australian tiger snake had paralyzed his respiratory muscles.

Dr. Findley W. Russel, international authority on snake bites, said however tests showed damage to the muscles and nerves was not as extensive as feared. He said there was a good chance Earnest would be able to live outside an iron lung, but probably always would have a weakened respiratory system.

Earnest was bitten by the three-foot snake May 17 at his parents' snake farm in Buena Park.

# Adenauer Says All Hopes for West Germany Destroyed

Bonn, Germany — (AP) — Chancellor Konrad Adenauer told Parliament today that Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev's sabotage of the Paris summit

conference "destroyed all our hopes."

A grim-faced Adenauer warned that "tension in the world is greater now than before" and said the West must be more on its guard than ever.

Adenauer praised President Eisenhower for his "dignity and calm" in the face of Khrushchev's "unrestrained insults."

"But every effort to save the conference failed," he said. "Khrushchev went to Paris with the aim of sabotaging the summit conference."

"Khrushchev's actions in Paris destroyed all our hopes. His attacks against the West and West Germany and his demands... make it impossible to discuss the topics on the agenda."

Adenauer, 84, already had expressed belief Khrushchev was saving his threats against West Berlin for a later date. He told leaders of his Christian Democratic party Monday Khrushchev was holding the threat "in reserve."

Today he indicated Khrushchev's action had destroyed West Germany's hope for reunification of Germany for a long time to come.

## State Centennial Finishes in Black

Portland — (AP) — The Oregon Centennial Commission met for the last time Monday and reported it finished in the black by \$26,000.

The Commission said nearly \$5 million was spent for last year's observance of the state's 100th birthday which featured a 100-day international trade fair and exposition.

William F. Gaarenstroom, fiscal officer assigned to the commission, said all assets have been sold or transferred to other state agencies except for an account receivable of \$1,250 which has been turned over for collection to the attorney general.

During the commission's life it received two legislative appropriations, totaling \$2,620,000.

The commission was appointed in 1955 by the late Gov. Paul Patterson.

## Secrecy Kept on Israeli Arrest Of Former Executioner for Hitler

Jerusalem, Israel — (AP) — Israel today kept a top-secret label on the case of Adolf Eichmann, former Nazi SS colonel charged with the murder of millions of Jews.

Premier David Ben-Gurion disclosed Eichmann's arrest in Parliament Monday, but most details of the case remained secret. The 54-year-old Eichmann, a fugitive since 1945, was being held in an undisclosed jail. Nothing was known of his capture or place of arrest.

Eichmann, who could be sentenced to death if convicted, stood stiffly at attention in a Jaffa court Monday when the charges against him were read. He was clean-shaven and well-groomed.

Chief Magistrate Yedidya Levy told Eichmann he was charged "with causing the death of millions of Jews in Germany and the enemy-occupied countries in the years 1938 to 1945."

Eichmann turned pale when the charge was translated, but his only answer to the court was to confirm his name and request counsel.

He was remanded for 14 days.

Eichmann could be given the death penalty under a provision of Israeli law aimed at
