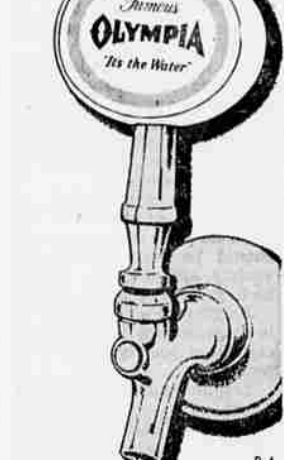
In other games, Spokane's Indians kept close by giving Seattle its fourth straight loss, 4-2, and Portland beat the Vancouver Mounties, 15-8.

U.S. Open List Now 480 Players

Completion of the first elimination round has trimmed the original entry list for the 1960 U.S. Open golf championships from 2,419 down to 480.

First round elimination tournaments at 54 sites on Monday and two more on Tuesday produced 421 golfers who will compete in the second round of eliminations at 13 different cities June 6-7. Also competing in the second round will be 48 golfers exempt from the first round.

Out of these 469 second-round competitors will come 129 qualifiers for the championship tournament itself at the Cherry Hills Country club, Denver, starting on June 16. Also competing in the championship flight will be 21 golfers exempt from all qualifying.

Regional Action
The two regional tourneys on Tuesday produced no changes in the national first-round leaders. High men in Tuesday competitions were amateur Robert Fay of Evansville, Ind., who led nine qualifiers at Indianapolis with a two-under-par score of 70-68-138, and Peter Marich of Reno, Nev., who led 12 qualifiers at San Francisco with 71-73-144.

The national leaders in first-round competition were three players who competed in the regional tourney at La Jolla, Calif. Tied at 133 there were amateurs M. O. Johnston Jr. and Charles Cortney, both of La Jolla, and pro Dick Collett of Coronado, Calif.

May Ring Award Goes To Becerra

New York—Paolo Rosi's surprise defeat by Eddie Perkins dropped the New Yorker from second to sixth in the lightweight division in the latest monthly boxing ratings released today by Ring magazine.

The magazine also named bantamweight champion Jose Becerra the "fighter of the month" for his successful defense of the crown against Japan's Kenji Yonekura.

Dave Charnley of England moved up from third place to replace Rosi in the No. 2 slot behind champion Joe Brown and No. 1 contender Carlos Ortiz. Perkins, of Chicago, was rewarded for his victory with the No. 9 spot.

Miteff Dropped
Alex Miteff of Argentina dropped from No. 6 to No. 7 among the heavyweights as a result of his loss to Eddie Machen of Portland, Ore. Machen remained in the No. 4 slot.

Willie Pastrano of Miami, Fla., dropping from the heavyweight to light-heavy ranks, was ranked No. 8 in that division.

Hank Casey of Richmond, Calif., crashed the middleweight ranks at the No. 9 spot as a result of his win over Henry Hank of Detroit, who dropped from No. 4 to No. 5.

Ex-champ Virgil Akins of St. Louis regained a rated berth among the welterweights at No. 9 by his victory over Charley Scott of Philadelphia. Scott dropped from No. 6 to No. 8.

City-Sponsored Angling Class Will Be Held

Registrations for a city-sponsored class in fishing instruction and the care and use of fishing equipment will be accepted at the Medford city hall on Thursday and Friday of this week and Tuesday of next week.
