Dr. Durno Discusses Traffic Violations With Area Officers

"We up in Salem do pay attention to you," State Sen. Dr. Edwin R. Durno told a dinner meeting of the Southern Oregon Association of Police officers Monday.

Durno made the statement after a number of the city, state and county police officers attending the meeting had asked questions and voiced opinions concerning some of the bills pertaining to law enforcement which will be presented to the next session of the state legislature.

Many of them had definite opinions on some of the bills and other aspects of police work, and Dr. Durno suggested that they make these known to their legislators either personally or through the mails.

He said there are two things which people must do in selecting persons for any public office. First, he said, they must choose good men, and second they must then keep these men informed of their wishes and desires once they are in office.

45 At Meeting Attending the meeting were some 45 police officers from as far away as Roseburg and Siskiyou county in California.

It is the purpose of the organization to create a better understanding among the various departments and to help coordinate their activities.

Dr. Durno said a number of ideas are being contemplated and studied by the state legislature which are of interest to police officers.

Commenting on a state speed limit, Lt. Earle Tichenor of the Oregon state police, Medford, said it is his opinion that the basic rule should be kept, but that there should also be a maximum speed limit.

This speed limit, he said, should be set according to the condition of a particular highway. On some highways, he said, it is safe to go 70 miles per hour and on others it is safe to go only 40 miles per hour or less.

Lieutenant Tichenor said, "we don't know how to enforce the basic rule." He added that officers often have to revert to the posted speed as the only criteria of determining whether or not a person is violating the basic rule.

Patrolman Gerald Butler, also of the Medford police department, suggested that when a driver's license is suspended the license plates also be taken away.

Cherry Fruit Fly Spray Is Needed

The first spray for the control of cherry fruit fly should be completed by May 31, according to Don Berry, county extension agent.

Growers are advised to use three pounds of methoxychlor per 100 gallons of water, or two heaping tablespoons of methoxychlor in three gallons of water and thoroughly spray all cherry trees.

This spray should be repeated at 10-day intervals until picking is completed. Do not use this combination closer than seven days before harvest, Berry advised.

Small sprayers would be ineffective on large trees but could be used on small trees. Diazinon may be substituted for the methoxychlor-malathion combination at the rate of two pounds per 100 gallons or two heaping tablespoons in three gallons of water.
