## Fort Lauderdale, Fla., Said Changing to Year-Round Spot

New York — Beauty and brains mix freely in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, says Gilbert P. Edwards, president of the Investment Corp. of Florida.

He made that statement in New York the other day and business men listened particularly to his reference to brains. His reference to beauty was to the climate and beaches and not to the ladies.

He finds this section of Florida changing to a year-round residential area and not just a winter resort as it was in the past. Many retired persons are included in the brain department to which he referred.

But there are others as well, falling into two classes—men who have started their own businesses there because they like the climate; and a group

of young or middle-aged business men who make Fort Lauderdale their permanent home base.

Formerly these executives may have lived in New York, Connecticut, Illinois or Utah. Some still keep their businesses in other states and fly back and forth in their own airplanes.

One thing that Edwards points out is that if your business can be centered in his area of Florida there's a big field from which to draw your corporate directors.

Edwards came to Florida 12 years ago and entered the real estate business. The chairman of the board of his company, Harry P. Greep, formerly worked as comptroller of a Chicago newspaper.

Then, there's director Howard Morley, former managing director of Thomas Board Mill, Ltd., of England and one time general manager of the book and bond division of International Paper Co. He's an expert on labor relations and plant development.

Another director — G. Har-

old Warner — like Morley, is retired. He formerly was treasurer, then auditor-general of the state of Pennsylvania. He's a financial expert, specializing in taxation.

John Wraether, only 36, represents the Independent Oil Producers of the National Petroleum Council.

Martin Hauser, is a director of the Milnot Corporation and

Litchfield Creamery Co. of Illinois.

Newell B. Wallace is vice president of Albert Krum, Inc. and Loveland Inc. (Michigan) as well as a director of Chemical Fund, the U.S. Sugar Corp., and Grow Solvents Co.

Alan P. Hart, retired, is a former president of Metaline Chemical Co.

Washington — The White House said Tuesday President Eisenhower still plans to visit Tokyo next month despite warnings by Japanese Socialists that they might demonstrate against him.

"So far as I know, the President is still going," Press Secretary James C. Hagerty told reporters.

Hagerty said he has received no official word of the Socialist opposition to the Eisenhower trip.

He said he was basing his comments on news stories from Tokyo concerning the warnings that the President would not be welcome in Japan.
