Mrs. Hamilton Returns from Trip to Chicago

Mrs. Moore Hamilton, member of the state board of education, returned to Medford this week from Chicago, Ill., where she visited a number of projects for the improvement of education financed by the Fund for Advancement of Education.

Four members of the state board of education and nine members of the state department of education have been visiting projects in other states this month.

The Fund for Advancement of Education granted \$5,000 for this travel and the state emergency board approved its use.

The trips were made preliminary to drafting a plan for a grant from the Fund under which some demonstration and experimental projects for improvement of education in Oregon may be conducted.

Visits in Chicago
Mrs. Hamilton visited in Chicago, Evanston, Arlington Heights and Cicero in Illinois. One day was spent at the University of Chicago.

Among projects visited she listed staff utilization team teaching, machine teaching and various uses of television in the school program.

Other centers visited by staff members in the state department of education and state board members include Hagerstown, Baltimore, Omaha, Madison, Northwalk, Cambridge, Lexington, Newton, Concord, Denver, Lakewood, Palo Alto, Stanford University and San Diego.

Returning west Mrs. Hamilton stopped in South Dakota to spend several days with her son, Alex M. Hamilton Jr., and family at Vermillion, where he will graduate from the University of South Dakota law school this summer.

Preliminary to her departure from Oregon, Mrs. Hamilton attended the twelfth annual conference on exceptional children sponsored by the special education section of the Oregon department of education in Eugene.

16-Story Building Set for Portland

Portland—(AP)—Plans for a new 16-story building in downtown Portland were announced Wednesday by Standard Insurance company.

The building will occupy a full city block, bounded by Southwest 5th and 6th avenues and Main and Madison streets.

President G. E. Cannon of Standard Insurance said the firm's building will be of glass and aluminum construction. It is scheduled for completion in 1963.

The structure will be set in a landscaped plaza with underground parking for 200 cars.

Reforestation in BLM District Ends

Artificial reforestation activities were completed early in May on 3,007 acres of bureau of land management lands in the Medford district, concluding this activity for the current reforestation season, according to Ross Youngblood, district manager.

Under procurement contracts, that is, contracts for planting determined by competitive bidding, a total of 1,116,500 tree seedlings were planted on 1,805 acres. In addition, direct tree seeding operations were performed via procurement contracts on 314 acres.

Planting accomplished via the terms of timber sale contracts amounted to 879 acres, which required 390,500 tree seedlings. Nine acres were direct-seeded via timber sale contracts.

Corvallis—(AP)—Plan to lay off 450 plywood workers in this area for a week in hopes the market will revive were revealed here Wednesday.

Roy Foy, manager of the Plywood Products operations here, said two plants in the Corvallis area and coastal operations would be shut down next week. He said the firm has "high hopes" that the week's layoff will stimulate the market to where operations can be resumed.
