## Area Information To Be in Magazine

Information of interest to industrial firms concerning the Medford area will appear in Industrial Development magazine, according to Don McNeil, Medford Chamber of Commerce manager.  
He said Medford has qualified nationally in the registered community audit, a service provided by the magazine, and information concerning this community will be publicized by the magazine "from time to time."  
The publication is sent to executives of manufacturing concerns. The chamber industrial committee has ordered a small supply to be used in response to certain inquiries and direct mail promotion, McNeil said.  
The local office staff spent several weeks gathering information in order that the details would qualify with the magazine.  
McNeil said the chamber doesn't know how much good the qualification will do, but "we think it's nice to have our phone number and vital statistics posted wherever possible."

## Exams Announced By Sen. Morse

Portland—Sen. Wayne Morse (D-Ore.) has announced that preliminary civil service examinations will be given in Oregon Monday, July 11, to young men interested in nomination to a service academy.  
Unmarried men in good physical condition who will have reached their 17th but not their 22nd birthday by July, 1961, are eligible to participate in the examination, he said.  
The tests are the first step toward possible appointment to the Military Academy at West Point, N.Y., Naval Academy at Annapolis, Md., Air Force Academy at Colorado Springs, Colo., or the Merchant Marine Academy at Kings Point, N.Y.  
The senator urged that young men interested in participating in the July 11 examination write to him immediately to obtain full information and learn the exact locations at which the tests will be administered. His address is 417 Senate Office Building, Washington 25, D.C.  
Morse emphasized that the deadline for receipt of inquiries by his office is June 15.

**Final Surveys Being Made for Gas Line**  
Bend—A multi-million dollar project to bring Canadian gas to Oregon and the western United States is in its final survey stages.  
Only certification by the federal power commission is holding back construction of the 614-mile line which will reach from Kingsgate on the Canadian-American border to Malin, south of Klamath Falls. The FPC examiner has given his approval of the project.  
Work on the 36-inch line is expected to get under way shortly after certification. A line from Klamath Falls to Medford is expected to be constructed following certification and by the time the gas reaches Klamath Falls.  
The United States section of the line is expected to cost \$129,600,000. Pacific Gas Transmission company will build and operate the line to the California-Oregon border and Pacific Gas and Electric will pick up the gas and carry it to the San Francisco area.  
Compressor stations are to be established along the route. Digging the trench through the old lavas of Deschutes country is expected to be among the heaviest work along the route.
