Boys Who Have Trouble Reading
Recently, Dr. George E. Park, an ophthalmologist in charge of studying difficulties with reading, wrote that some four times as many boys as girls have trouble with reading. A number of these children are a bit peculiar. Some had sluggish reflexes, which means they responded too slowly to a stimulus, while 11 per cent had exaggerated reflexes; 6 per cent had twitching of the face, or symptoms suggesting St. Vitus Dance.

What is most suggestive is that half of the children had slightly abnormal electroencephalograms (records of the tiny electric currents constantly being formed in the brain). Other experts have found a similarly high percentage of abnormal electric records. Another indication that these children have a poorly functioning nervous system is the fact that 18 per cent of those studied by Dr. Park were the late. Some of the children have night terrors, which again suggests an abnormally acting brain. Some 14 per cent of the children had had abscessed ears, and some had a loss of hearing. Some 9 per cent of these children were late in learning to talk, which suggests a slow development of the brain. Some of the children were emotionally upset, and frustrated. Some of them wrote their letters backwards.

All this strongly suggests that a simple change in the technique of teaching children in school is not what is needed. The problem goes deeper than that.

Gondolas Fading From Venice Scene
Venice, Italy—The swanlike gondola, almost a trademark in this city of canals, is fading from the Venetian scene, giving way to motorboats and the modern desire to go places in a hurry.

About 10,000 gondolas cruised the canals of Venice in 1950. By the start of World War II, this number had dwindled to 600, and today there are only 435.

The only thing that keeps the gondoliers going is the tourist season when some 800,000 visitors come to Venice, almost all of them with a desire to ride in a gondola. The Venetian takes a steamer, or a motorboat, the "taxi" of Venice. He cannot be bothered with a leisurely ride by gondola to do his afternoon shopping.

A gondolier makes about \$2,000 during the four-month height of the tourist season. He is lucky to make a fourth of that during the remaining eight months of the year.

The men who make and repair the gondolas have been almost as hard hit. Years ago there were hundreds. Now there are only three. When they die or retire, there is no one to take their place.
