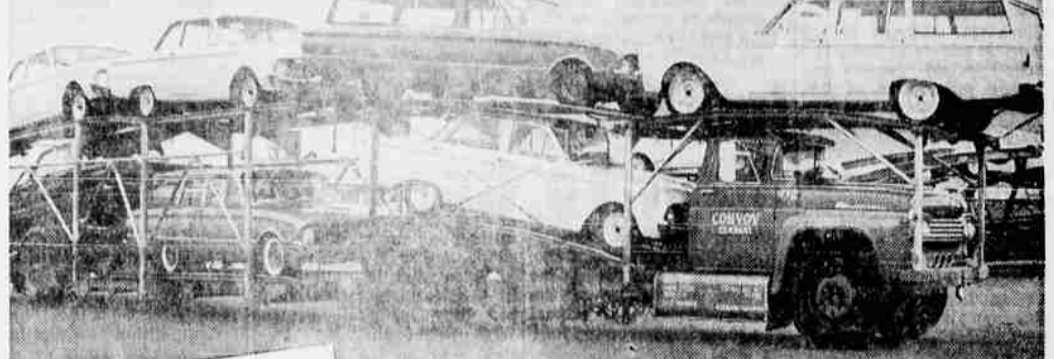
Orioles Have Catcher-Basket Catcher's Mitt

New York—UPI—Inventive Paul Richards has come up with a "peach-basket" type catcher's mitt to cut down on the passed balls among Baltimore relievers. Clint Courtney was to test the new mitt when he handles knuckle-baller Hoyt Wilhelm in a game against the Yankees today and the glove will be available to all Oriole catchers whenever Wilhelm pitches.

Designed by Richards, with the aid of the Wilson Sporting Goods Co., the glove in one and one-half the size of an ordinary catcher's mitt in circumference and almost a half-pound heavier.

Baltimore catchers have caught a total of 14 passed balls so far this season, mostly while handling Wilhelm, and Richards believes that most of the passed balls have resulted because Wilhelm's knuckle has bounced off the top of his catcher's mitt.
