Portland - (UPI) - A Portland General Electric transmission line carrying 4,160 volts was burned through and dropped to the ground here Saturday. PGE officials said witnesses reported a youth swung a chain over the wires. The chain struck a bare part of the line and caused a hot circuit. The wires burned through and dropped to the pavement. No one was injured.

Hatfield Exercises Clemency 5 Times

Salem - (UPI) - Gov. Mark Hatfield has exercised executive clemency five times since he took office in 1959 - but none of them involved capital punishment.

The forms of clemency included two conditional commutations, one for a man convicted of second degree murder and sentenced to a life term.

He has also given a full pardon to a man convicted of assault and robbery.

Fairweather Gets Phoenix Contract

Phoenix - The Phoenix school board Friday night awarded a contract to Frank Fairweather, Medford contractor, to construct five classrooms, additional heating facilities and an administrative office at the Phoenix High school, according to Superintendent Ernest James.

Fairweather submitted a low base bid of \$79,042 plus portions of three alternates for a total contract figure of \$92,846, James explained. Construction will start about June 6, after school is dismissed.

The bond issue of \$700,000 recently passed by Phoenix school district patrons will pay for the new construction plus school furniture and equipment for the new rooms and administrative office.

Repair and re-flooring of the Talent school gymnasium to be used for Junior high school students will also be financed by the bond issue, Robert J. Keeney, Medford architect, will design the construction, James said.

Other bids on the project were submitted by Myers D. Jones construction company, \$79,788; Ausland Construction company, Grants Pass, \$83,980; and Barnhart construction company, Medford, \$98,413.

Bids Opened for Hiatt Fish Screens

Low bid for construction of a fish screen structure at Hiatt dam was submitted by Thomas J. Parker and Associates, Inc., 42 East Main st., Ashland, at \$18,257, according to the bureau of reclamation.

Other bidders were Petretn and Purdy, Central Point, at \$21,181, and Clave Construction company, Medford, at \$32,352. Government estimate was \$18,894.

Nixon Campaign Expenses Listed

Salem - (UPI) - It cost backers of Vice President Richard Nixon \$46,633 to stage his campaign in Oregon for the GOP presidential nomination in the primary election a week ago, according to expense reports filed with the state elections division here.

Nixon was unopposed on the ballot. The expense was the largest yet received by the division. Reports for expenses of Sen. John F. Kennedy (D-Mass.) and Sen. Wayne Morse (D-Ore.), candidates for the presidential nomination, have not been received yet.

Of the Nixon total, \$47,000 came from the Dick Nixon club of Washington, D.C., leaving an Oregon campaign surplus.
