The Family Council

Editor's Note: The Family Council consists of a Judge, a psychiatrist, three clergymen, a newspaper editor, a women's editor and two writers. Each article is a summary of an actual case history. The Council reports on problems that have been dealt with by responsible agencies and counselors.

Irma K.—He's just afraid of losing Vivian.
Arthur K.—Not true—I want her to enjoy her freedom.

Irma K.—My husband and I are having a serious disagreement about our 18-year-old daughter Vivian.
She has been going out with a fine young man of 21 for the past year. They want to marry and I'm all for it. George has just gotten out of the service and is going into his father's business. He comes from a good family and is everything we could want in a husband for our daughter.

My husband feels that they are both simply too young. At least, that's what he says he feels. I think he hates to see Vivian leave home. We have two younger sons, and he has always been very much attached to Vivian. He doesn't want to lose her so soon. But after all, it is more important for her to live her own life.

Arthur K.—What Irma says just isn't so. Of course, I'll be sorry to see Vivian leave so soon, but that's not the main consideration.

The main thing is that she is a kid, just getting out of high school. She doesn't know anything about life. Right now, the idea of being married and having her own home seems like the most romantic thing in the world to her. But she doesn't know the meaning of real work and responsibility. In a year or two, she'll be raising a family and she'll wonder why her parents didn't warn her that marriage isn't one long picnic.

Why shouldn't Vivian enjoy a few more years of freedom? If George loves her he'll wait. If not, she'll find another boy, just as good.

The Council: There has been much controversy among various experts in the fields of human relations about the desirability of early marriages. Those who are for it point out the "steadying influence" of marriage on both young men and women.

No doubt many of these early marriages work out well. But the statisticians point out that the divorce rate for brides under 20 is three times the over-all average in the country. That is certainly something to think about. It must also be remembered that for every couple whose marriage founders completely, there are many others whose marriages verge on disaster through many years.

It would be impossible for outsiders to judge how much chance Vivian has of making a successful marriage. The fact that she has found a highly desirable young man speaks well for her, but it is only a beginning. It is important to consider her general maturity.

Few girls of 18 today are well-prepared to take on homemaker and family-rearing responsibilities. They think that modern conveniences have taken all the drudgery out of homemaking and are very much surprised when they find more is involved in the job than just taking food out of the freezer. Most of them are also totally unprepared for dealing with another individual's tastes and habits. It rarely occurs to the girl of 18 that her ardent suitor could ever become dis-

manding, morose, unyielding. Vivian could be the exception. She could have rare common sense, a heavenly disposition, a love of homemaking. In that case, it would be a shame to put a few more years between her and great happiness. But if she isn't that exception, we think a one or two year waiting period would be all to her advantage.
