

Dairy Maid Nine Halves NW Series

Memorial Stadium, White City - Rogue Valley Dairy Maids, with Ellen Callaghan throwing two-hit ball, shut out Martinizer Cleaners of Portland 4 to 0 yesterday to claim a series split in week end Northwest Women's Major Softball league play.

The Portland team, which has been known part of the time as the B Queens, won on Saturday evening 8 to 4.

The Dairy Maids are now 3-3 in the loop. Rogue Valley on Sunday gained two runs in the first inning on two errors, a fielder's option and a three-bagger by Callaghan. The two additional counts came in the fourth canto on Doris Hickson's double, Callaghan's single and an error.

Hickson and Callaghan each hit two for three. Callaghan whiffed five batters and gave three free trips to the base paths. Marian Kozak, pitching for Martinizer, allowed seven hits, while fanning four and walking just one.

Great Big Inning
The Cleaners massed all their runs in the third inning on Saturday night. Martinizer's eight markers were on only three hits. There were two bases on balls, a sacrifice bunt, a sacrifice flyout and all five Dairy Maid miscues. Jan Ruhlman doubled and Bonita Mooney and Bea Perry each singled. Maddy Lindsay had the bunt sacrifice and Kozak the flyout which scored a run.

First Maid tally was in the third inning Saturday on a hit by Hickson, an error and a single by Callaghan. Safeties by Shirley Hanson and Pat Barron, two bases on balls, a fielder's option and a stolen base accounted for the other three in the fifth canto.

Portland pitcher Kozak registered seven strikeouts to four by Barron. The Maids play a doubleheader next Saturday at Port Angeles, Wash.
