The Grandmother Who Is Worried About A Grandchild

I get many letters from unhappy grandmothers who are much worried because they feel that their grandchildren are not receiving good food or good training or good medical care. Perhaps grandmother sees the children each evening watching on television a murder or near-murder or knock-down brawl after another. She wonders why her daughter is going to such effort to teach her children how to murder people and how to become capable of scenes of murder.

Or, grandmother sees a child with flaring ears, or a squinting eye, or a bad birth mark or a receding chin, or she sees that her grandson is becoming psychotic because his testicles haven't come down, and his swimming mates are jeering at him. She wonders why her daughter does not get the defect operated on quickly, before the child's temperament is badly injured. She wonders if I would write her daughter and tell her what she surely should be doing.

I sympathize deeply with these wise grandmothers, and I wish I could help them, but I am sure I had better not "start anything," and I suspect that grandmother had better not fuss too much. If the daughter or son cannot take a quiet and tactful suggestion, more talk probably will only anger them. If I were the grandmother and had a little money put by, I might offer to pay for the

Story Revived of Amelia Earhart's Death on Saipan

San Mateo, Calif. (UPI)—A woman who formerly lived on Saipan Island has revived the story that Amelia Earhart might have been executed by Japanese soldiers.

The San Mateo Times said in a copyright story last week, that Mrs. Josephine Blanco Akiyama, who now lives in San Mateo, told of a plane that landed on Saipan at the approximate time of the famous aviator's disappearance on July 2, 1937.

Mrs. Akiyama, who was 11 at the time, said she saw the woman pilot from a distance of about 100 feet and that her appearance was that of Miss Earhart.

Miss Earhart and her navigator, Frederick Noonan, were en route from Lae, New Guinea, to Howland Island on a round the world flight.

Would Be Off Course
 If they landed at Saipan they would have been approximately 3,000 miles from their Howland destination and some 45 degrees off course.

Portlander, 82, Beaten, Robbed

Portland—UPI—Police today investigated the beating of an 82-year-old man here after he was attacked and robbed of about \$5 Sunday night.

The victim was Nicholas Anderson. He was rushed to Portland Sanitarium with severe head laceration and bruises which police said were inflicted with a heavy, blunt instrument.

He was found by neighbors Monday morning after they became concerned because his shades were drawn. They entered the back door of the man's small apartment and found him lying on his blood-stained bed.

Anderson told officers he was awakened Sunday night by a man who started beating him over the head.

Hospital attendants said his condition was serious.

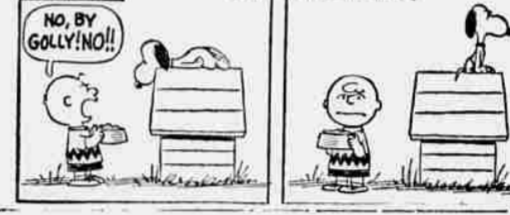
