## Head Noises, Dizziness and Meniere's Disease

One of the commonest complaints, especially of older persons, is of head noises, often with dizziness, and occasional lightheadedness and vomiting. Usually the first question in the physician's mind is, are the noises due to disease in the ears or are they arising in some area of the brain injured by a "stroke"? If the person is under 40 he is likely to have ear trouble, but if he is over 60 he is very likely to have arteriosclerosis in his brain.

If he has Meniere's disease, which is due to an abnormality in the lining of the balancing mechanism in his inner ears, then, sooner or later, he must have some loss of hearing. If a man of 60 who has had a bad dizzy spell and now has ear noises is told by a good and honest ear man that his hearing is normal, then he cannot have Meniere's disease, and there is no sense in his traveling around the country from one ear man to another.

With the sudden spells of Meniere's disease, a young person will feel that he or she

room is spinning around; he may be thrown to the floor where he may vomit. The old person who has had perhaps one dizzy and woozy spell usually will say that there was no spinning around—only a feeling of loss of the normal good and comfortable sense of balance. Often the doctor can tell that the brain was injured because, during the spell, the man saw double, or for a few hours an arm was numb and clumsy, or for some weeks afterward his memory was poor, or he was irritable, irascible and unreasonable, and perhaps unable to work.

Unfortunately, we doctors haven't any very good treatment for either Meniere's disease or the little strokes. We may give the patient unaltered food, or we may give nicotinic acid or histamine or anti-histamines, but the results are seldom spectacular. The patient's greatest hope will be that his disease will go away by itself and leave him alone.

## Nixon Expects to Trail Gov. Brown In California Vote

Washington—(UPI)—Vice President Richard M. Nixon is conceding in advance that he will trail Gov. Edmund G. Brown in the California presidential primaries June 7, according to his aides.

Nixon is unopposed in the Republican primary in his home state while Brown, a favorite son candidate for the presidential nomination, has competition in the Democratic primary. Brown's opponent is George McLain, a promoter of old age pension plans.

The Vice President was said to feel that he would poll fewer votes than Brown because Democratic registration in California exceeds that of the GOP by a margin of about 3 to 2. Another reason was that the Democrats have turned out a larger vote in presidential primaries in recent election years in California.

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# Flood Control Projects in 36 States Approved

Washington—(UPI)—The Senate public works committee has approved a bill authorizing federal outlays totaling \$1,580,506,352 for 128 navigation, flood control and other water development projects in 36 states.

Amending a \$647,776,000 authorization bill which passed the House last July, the Senate committee approved all of the 50 projects in that measure and added 78 more.

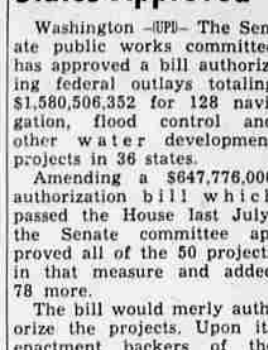
The bill would merely authorize the projects. Upon its enactment backers of the projects would have to persuade Congress to vote the actual money in a separate appropriations bill before construction work could begin.

Almost half the authorization approved by the Senate committee—some \$740 million—was earmarked for continuing work on four river basin projects.

It would increase by that amount previous authorizations for work on comprehensive development of water resources in the Arkansas and Columbia river basins and for completion of Barkley dam on the Lower Cumberland in Kentucky. The house approved \$462 million for these purposes.

The Senate version of the rivers and harbors bill would authorize funds for 65 navigation, 37 flood control, 15 multiple-purpose, 8 beach erosion and 3 hurricane-flood control projects.

In addition, the bill would authorize surveys to determine the feasibility of 16 additional navigation projects, and 10 additional flood control works. It authorized no construction funds for these projects.
