New Visiting Area Operating in Jail

The new visiting section in the Jackson county jail is operating satisfactorily, Sheriff Joe Walsh said today.
Members of the U.S. Marshal's office who have left prisoners in the county jail said they have not seen anything like it in other jails they have visited across the country, Walsh added.
The new section consists of a baffle arrangement with holes on the outer plate separating the prisoners from visitors, a slotted steel plate behind this with slots which do not line up with the holes and another baffle plate inside the section with slots at top and bottom.
This way prisoners and visitors can talk, but nothing can be passed between the bars, the sheriff explained.
The partition to the jail office has been removed, giving the jailer a better view of the visiting section from his desk, Walsh said.
