Justice Goodwin Gets Nomination

Portland—(AP)—State Supreme Court Justice Alfred T. Goodwin was nominated for the position here Thursday night.

Goodwin, former Lane county circuit judge, was appointed to the position by Gov. Mark Hatfield to succeed Sen. Hall S. Lusk.

Glenn R. Jack, chairman of Goodwin's statewide campaign committee, said Goodwin was nominated by 321 votes at a nominating convention in the Sheraton hotel. Goodwin must run for the position in the November election.

Heat Wave Bakes North California

A record-breaking heat wave scorched Northern California with 100-degree temperatures Thursday.

The mercury soared to 107 at Hayward and set off a fire alarm in a frozen food plant. San Francisco recorded an all-time high for June 2 when the thermometer hit 95, two degrees above the old record set in 1912.

In Marin, Contra Costa and San Mateo counties, surrounding San Francisco, 108-degree heat was reported. A poultry farm at Sebastopol reported that 8,500 hens died as the temperature hit 105.

A 60-year-old construction worker at Pacific collapsed and died of heat prostration. The Weather Bureau predicted more "very hot" readings today from Arizona into Northern California.
