**Evaluation Test Given Medford CAP Squadron**

Civil Air Patrol's Medford squadron was host to six Southern Oregon CAP squadrons in a group evaluation test conducted at the local headquarters recently. The test was reported to be successful.

Participating were delegates from Corvallis, Roseburg, Bend, Bay Area, Eugene, MahlorSweet, and Medford. Assisting was an Air Force evaluation team from the Portland Air Force base with a CAP inspection team from the Oregon Wing, Portland. The group evaluated the procedure used during a simulated downed aircraft search within a 50-mile radius of the Medford airport.

During the test, aircraft for Southern Oregon squadrons attending conducted the search in their designated areas. Mobile and fixed radio support supplied information to cadet training units under senior supervision.

Mission commander Lt. John Keener, Medford Squadron head. The evaluation team from Portland included Lt. Col. Patrick Mose, deputy for operations, and his staff; Capt. Barbara Anton, administration; Capt. Annabelle Sterne, finance officer; and Maj. William Greer, Portland Air Force base, and staff.

The problem involved a Navy aircraft en route to Alameda, Calif., from Sand Point, Wash. It was to have reported engine failure over the Evans Creek area, four minutes from the local airport. Radio silence indicated that the aircraft was presumed down and the CAP units began operations.

**Duncan Attorney Files for Delay**

Los Angeles — (UPI) — A stay of execution was asked Friday for Mrs. Elizabeth Duncan and two hired killers by an attorney who claims they were denied a fair trial.

A. L. Wirin said he filed the application for a delay of the execution of Mrs. Duncan and Luis Moya, 22, and Augustine Baldonado, 26, pending an appeal to the U.S. Supreme Court. The attorney said the appeal is based on a claim that the trio was denied a fair trial because of prejudicial statements made by Ventura County District Attorney Roy Gustafson.

Wirin said he would file the appeal Wednesday. The three were convicted in Ventura last year on charges of slaying Mrs. Duncan's daughter-in-law, Olga Duncan, 30. They are scheduled to die June 13 at San Quentin prison.

**Booklet Shows One Day Trip in Area**

"One Day of Southern Oregon History," a 10-page booklet reviewing a guided tour of Jackson and Josephine counties, has been completed by Jack Sutton, Grants Pass high school teacher. The booklet is available in this area.

Contents of the publication include pictures, maps, historical information, famous portraits, and travel markers.

Purpose of the booklet is to assist visitors and schools conducting field trips in the southern-Oregon area.

Facts and figures quoted by Sutton have been authenticated by the Southern Oregon Historical Society and the Siskiyou Pioneer Sites Foundation.

The cover boasts a picture of Jacksonville taken in 1854. Also featured is the noted Peter Britt home and studio. Further references mention places in the Applegate, on the Rogue river, near Table Rock, in Grants Pass in 1886, Central Point and other points of general interest.

**Diabetes and Leukemia**

One of the next big advances in medicine is now coming because of a study of medical genetics. Every month interesting discoveries are being made in this field, and they fascinate me. No one I read that at a recent meeting of the California Medical Association, Dr. Daniel Stowens, while reporting studies of 285 children with acute leukemia, noted that in 25 per cent of them there was some member of the family who had diabetes. Among non-leukemic children such a relation to diabetes was found in only 4 per cent of the cases.

Also interesting was the fact that 10 per cent of the leukemic children had diabetes, and all of the leukemic children had abnormal cells in their islets of Langerhans. This is the abnormality found in all but some rare cases of diabetes. What does this mean? It means that there is some relation between the two diseases that we must now study with care; which reminds me that recently it was found that quite a few mongoloid mentally retarded children have leukemia. Even more of them have leukemia-like abnormalities in their white blood cells.

We doctors often learn something about rare diseases by studying these strange relationships. Recently I helped open up one of these fascinating fields in medicine by making a record of all of the curious symptoms and diseases that came to bother 673

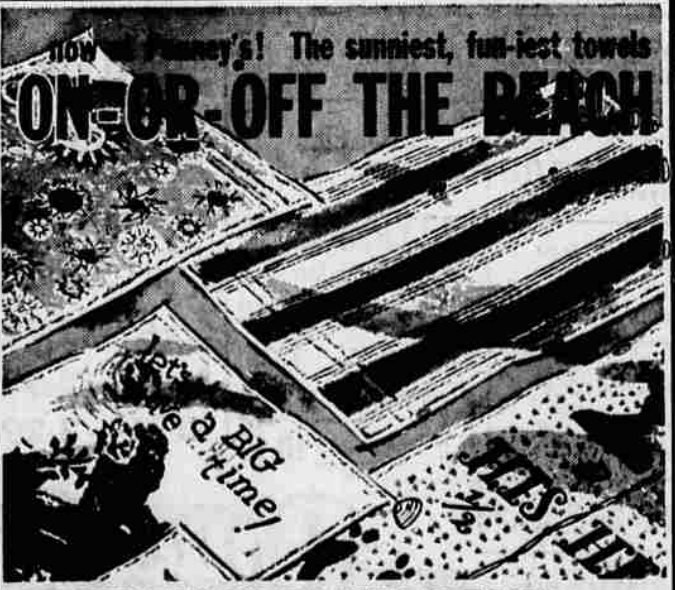
