Salem - (UPI) - Thirty more months in prison were meted here Friday to an inmate who threatened to sock his own attorney in the nose in court while the attorney was defending him on his escape charge.

Circuit court levied the sentence on John Grady Phippen. He was serving two years for burglary from Douglas county when he escaped from the prison annex last Feb. 29.

During an April 18 hearing on the escape charge, Phippen got into an argument with his defense attorney and threatened to punch the lawyer. Phippen was found guilty of escape, and the 30 months was added to his original sentence.

The nomination by 321 votes will serve to place Goodwin's name on the November general election ballot.

Goodwin is a former Lane county circuit judge.

Airline Wants to Make Idaho Stop

Baker - (UPI) - West Coast Airlines recommended Friday that its stop at Burley-Rupert, Ida., be continued.

This was the main action to come out of a three-day Civil Aeronautics Board hearing on recertifying West Coast stops in five Eastern Oregon and Idaho cities.

Herman Schuerer, vice president of West Coast, asked that the Idaho landing be recertified on the basis of a more than 200 per cent increase in boardings in the first five months of 1960 over the same period in 1959.

The airline took a neutral stand on recertification for La Grande presently on the schedule, Baker and Ontario, Ore., and McCall, Ida.

Decisions on all five stops will be made by the CAB, meeting in Washington, D.C.

Sheriffs Favor Police Academy

Bend - (UPI) - The Oregon State Sheriff's association, meeting in Bend Friday adopted a resolution favoring establishment of a police academy in Oregon.

The resolution followed a speech by State Sen. Carl Francis (R-Dayton) advocating the academy.

Francis, a Republican candidate for attorney general in November, introduced a resolution in the legislature two years ago calling for an interim committee to study the academy idea and report to the next session. The resolution died in committee.

Salem Inmates to Testify at Trial

Salem - (UPI) - The Oregon state penitentiary is going to temporarily release two of its inmates, one a former acting police chief, so they may testify in a case in Colorado involving an alleged crime ring.

The inmates are Howard Clifford Moore, 41, and Oliver Lusk, 26. During the trial they will be lodged in Colorado prison.

Moore for a brief time was acting police chief of Brownsville, Ore. He is also a former deputy sheriff in Colorado.

Moore was arrested in October, 1959 in Albany, Ore., and some \$10,000 in stolen property was recovered in his home. Lusk was arrested as an accomplice in a burglary ring.

Colorado officials say the two are key witnesses against alleged members of the same ring now charged with various crimes and held in Colorado.

Lumber Market Continues Slow

Portland - (UPI) - A continued slow, competitive lumber and plywood market in the week ending Friday was reported by Crow's Lumber Market News Service Saturday.

Trading appeared to be more active in a few sections of the country, according to the report, but on a national basis, the volume of orders was still below production.

Most of the slowdown was accredited to a lower rate of housing starts.

Contract Awarded For Staff Houses
