Standards Given For Livability Of Housing Unit

Urbana, Ill. - (UPI) - Brides should judge the livability of a house or apartment by four standards, University of Illinois Home Economist Robble Blakemore said.

Here is Miss Blakemore's checklist:

Flexibility: Are areas or rooms divided by folding doors, screens or shutters where flexibility is desired? Are future additions to a house feasible as a family expands?

Circulation: Can major living areas be reached without passing through other areas? How easy is it to get from garage to kitchen? How accessible is the bathroom to the bedrooms?

Ease of furniture placement: How well will the rooms receive furniture? A rectangular room is most suited to living-room furniture. Sometimes, a square room makes the best bedroom.

Storage capacity: Are there enough storage spaces in all areas of the house... for linens, cleaning materials, bedding, lawn furniture? Are closets deep enough and otherwise ample?
