Special Features Of Summer Season Noted at College

Ashland—Special feature of the 1960 summer session at Southern Oregon college will include the Siskiyou Band Camp, outstanding workshops, and the Institute of Renaissance Studies, Dr. Bill Sampson, director of summer sessions has announced.

The term will run from June 20 through Aug. 12, with a special post session from August 15-28. Regular credit courses will be offered for credit in art, music, education, psychology, health and physical education, humanities, science, mathematics, and social science.

A full course in a teacher-librarian program, designed to train teacher-librarians for small and medium sized elementary and high schools, will be a new offering for Southern Oregon college.

The Institute of Renaissance Studies, in cooperation

with the Oregon Shakespearean Festival, will give field courses in letters and the arts as a part of a study of the Festival. The institute is under the direction of Dr. Margery Bailey, Stanford university.

Guest conductor for the Siskiyou Band Camp, to be held July 18 to 29, will be Randall Spicer, nationally known expert on bands and band literature from Washington State university. Founder-coordinator is Glenn T. Matthews, assistant professor of music at SOC.

Thirteen special workshop classes will be offered during the summer session, Dr. Sampson reported. Regular workshops will begin June 13 and run through the end of the term, Aug. 12. Three special classes will be offered in the post session for elementary education.

Club and Camp Leadership, with Dan Bulkley and Audio Visual Aids, with Larry Butler, will be offered June 13 to 24.

Arithmetic in the school will be instructed by Chester Squire and Hobart Jackson, June 20 to July 1. Reading in the school, with Evelyn Barker, will be given July 5 to 15. Science in the school will be offered from July 18 to 29, concurrent with the Siskiyou Band Camp.

Aug. 1 to 12 four seminars will be offered: music in the elementary school, Helene Robinson; art in the school, Ruth Halvorsen; human relations in Shakespeare, George Bell and Dr. Arthur Solomon; and selected Shakespearean plays, Dr. Kenneth Clarke and Dr. Solomon.

During the post session, Aug. 15 to 26, three classes will be given; social science in the elementary school; language arts in the elementary school; and Spanish in the elementary school.

Peaceful Living Topic of Lecture

Scientific awareness of God's ever-ness and power brings more peaceful living, safety and abundance, Theodore Wallach, of Chicago, Ill., told members of the First Church of Christ, Scientist, here Thursday.

The accumulation of material resources does not give one true security any more than the accumulation of armaments give real security to a nation, the former First Reader of the Mother Church, First Church of Christ, Scientist, Boston, Mass., said.

Subject of the talk was, "Christian Science: A Fresh Approach to Security." He opened his talk with a discussion of the battle for men's minds, the great barrage of propaganda being directed today at the individual.

Wallach stressed the need for greater alertness and pointed out one reason for a sense of insecurity is the general belief in the authenticity and power of evil.

Every subtle hint of fear, frustration, sin, disease, or disaster is "only an attempt of the carnal mind to mislead, to fool one into believing that evil is actual, to shut one's eyes to the glorious presence of God, good," he stated.

Bids Opened on School Equipment By Ashland Board

Ashland—Bids on typewriters and one set of bleachers for Ashland's new junior high school were opened Wednesday night, but School Superintendent Stanley Jobe said contracts probably would not be awarded until the school board meeting June 13.

Jobe and Junior High school Principal Willard Smith will be in Portland Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday to inspect merchandise offered by bidders on bleachers as well as those bidding on about \$105,000 worth of furniture needed at the school.

Five Firms Bid
Five firms submitted bids on the 35 typewriters needed. The school district also will trade in 10 used machines.

Bidders were Jewett Office Supply, Medford, \$3,810 on Royals; Medford Stationery, \$4,330 on Smith-Coronas; Office Stationery and Supply, Medford, \$4,500 on 12-inch Olympias, and \$4,150 on 10-inch Olympias; Ashland Office Supply, \$4,500 on Smith-Coronas and \$4,150 on R.C. Allens; and Volights, Medford, \$3,990 on Underwoods.

Six Portland firms submitted bids on the one set of 88-foot-long, 12-row bleachers

wanted for the school. Bidders were J. K. Gill, \$7,655 on Wayne bleachers; B.F. Shearer, \$7,428.50 on Narragansett; Frank D. Cohan, \$9,198.63 on Berlin-Chapman; Washington-Oregon School Supply, \$8,491 on Brunswick; Northern School Supply, \$8,388 on Medart, and Rod Muzzy and Co., \$8,970 on Universal.
