Hitler Photograph Declared 'Fake'

London - (AP) - A British historian said in the Daily Express today that an alleged photograph of Adolf Hitler carried in a Soviet newspaper was a "fake."

The picture appeared in the May 15 edition of Kazakhstan Pravda and shows the head of a man resembling Hitler lying on the ground with a bullet hole through the forehead.

Historian Hugh Trevor-Roper, author of "The Last Days of Hitler," told the Daily Express:

"I think this is a fake. The evidence is conclusive that Hitler's body was dug up by the Russians and identified before May 9, 1945."

AWOL Soldier's Charge Reduced

Klamath Falls - (AP) - Bernard J. Fitzpatrick, 18, AWOL soldier originally charged with first degree murder in the bayonet stabbing of Ralph Ray Lawson of Pasco, Wash., today faced a reduced charge of voluntary manslaughter.

Lawson, a motorist, had picked up Fitzpatrick in Sacramento and was driving him north. Lawson was killed near Crescent, Klamath county, early on Jan. 31, authorities said. His body was found later near Rhododendron, Ore.

Russia Said Making Flights Over U.S.

Tokyo - (AP) - A British embassy publication said today that the Soviet Union has been making high altitude flights over the United States for some time.

"British Opinion," which is compiled from British press reports, said that "evidence of espionage by Soviet agents of the world around is as voluminous as it is multiform."

"Now many of these activities are more sly than sinister, but in addition to this, the Russians have for a long time been making high altitude flights over the United States and other Western countries," it said.

President Eisenhower told his news conference May 11 that as far as he knew there had never been any Soviet spy flights over the United States.

Aid To Education Bill in Conference

Washington - (AP) - The Senate sent the controversial aid-to-education issue to conference today in a move to speed a legislative clean-up that would permit Congress to adjourn before the 1960 political conventions.

Members of the House and Senate committees will confer in an effort to work out a compromise on differing bills to provide federal aid for school construction.

Senate Democratic Leader Lyndon B. Johnson told newsmen in advance of the action that he "hopes and believes" Congress will complete its work and avoid returning to Washington after the July political conventions.
