

Tribe Takes Lead In American Loop

Could be that trader Frank Lane got the bargain basement buy of the season in Johnny Klippstein.

For "slightly more than" the \$20,000 waiver price, Lane brought the Cleveland Indians the type of relief pitcher who is indispensable to a pennant drive.

Compared to some of Frankie's more flamboyant big-name player trades, the Klippstein deal didn't attract much notice this spring. But the way he's been pitching, the 32-year-old right-hander has done a lot to maintain Lane's reputation as a shrewd flesh-peddler.

Klippstein, who knocked around the National League for 10 years before Lane bought him from the Los Angeles Dodgers, turned in another

glittering relief job Wednesday as the Indians swept a double-header from the Boston Red Sox, 8-7 and 5-2, and took over first place in the American league.

Summoned from the bullpen for the 12th time this season when young Jim Perry faltered in the first game, Klippstein retired nine men in a row to protect the one-run lead. He now has allowed only two earned runs in his last 19 1/3 relief innings.

The double triumph, which ruined Del Baker's fill-in managerial debut for the Red Sox, put the Indians in first place by 10 percentage points ahead of the Baltimore Orioles, who lost to the Detroit Tigers, 2-0.

In other American League night games, the New York Yankees defeated the Chicago White Sox, 6-0, and the Washington Senators beat the Kansas City Athletics, 8-6.

In the National League, the Pittsburgh Pirates maintained a one-game lead with a 5-3 victory over the Chicago Cubs while the second-place San Francisco Giants edged the Cincinnati Reds, 2-1, on Eddie Bressoud's ninth-inning two-run single. Both were day games.

At night, Duke Snider hit the 361st home run of his career to help the Dodgers rally for a 4-1 victory over the Milwaukee Braves and the Philadelphia Phillies topped the St. Louis Cardinals, 5-4, on rookie Tony Curry's pinch eighth-inning, bases-loaded double.

McLemore 3rd in NAIA In Batting

—Kern McLemore, Oregon college baseball star, was named third in the NAIA batting statistics with his .511 batting average, and SOC as a pitcher placed fourth with a .327 mark.

John Younger gained honors as a pitcher on the Raider squad by being ranked 13th with a 2.10 earned run average. He was also 12th in strikeouts with 50 and a 9.6 game average which placed him tops in Oregon.

Jess Munyon also gained mention in the batting statistics with his .389 average which gained him a national 30th place.

Team captain Red Raiders led in pitching with 10 wins and earned run yield average of 1.25.

Oregon closed out the season with a 12-5 record and second place in the Oregon Collegiate conference as Oregon College took top honors. SOC had an 8-2 OCC record and closed out the season with a nine-game win streak.

Bout Won By Machen

Chicago (UPI)—Heavyweight Eddie Machen and his manager, Sid Flaherty, figured today they were "two or three fights" away from a shot at the world championship.

Eddie decided to try horse Alonzo Johnson in 10 rounds Wednesday night, outspeeding his foe for an unpopular and loudly booed unanimous decision.

But it was his 34th win in 37 pro bouts, and it left him with a potential elimination match against Sonny Liston, rated the No. 1 heavyweight contender.

"It depends on how the Ingemar Johansson-Floyd Patterson fight comes out," Flaherty said. "If Johansson wins, then I think we can make the fight. If Patterson wins, well, he'd never fight us before and it's my understanding he won't fight us now."

Injury in Ring Kills Pacheco

New York (UPI)—Tommy Pacheco, young Puerto Rican lightweight boxer injured in his 13th professional bout Monday night, died early today of brain damage.

Pacheco, 19, had been unconscious since he was knocked out in the 10th round by Bennie Gordon, 21.

Giants Win Dramatic Encounter

San Francisco (UPI)—Jack Sanford, the right-handed half of the San Francisco Giants' one-two pitching punch, took the hill today.

And if Jack came up with the same type performance that the southpaw side—Mike McCormick—tossed yesterday, manager Bill Rigney would be more than happy.

The Giants got only six hits Wednesday, but the slumping Orlando Cepeda got three of these to signify that he may have broken his jinx.

Mike McCormick, going for his eighth win of the season, had a no-hitter for seven and one-third innings. He allowed only three hits for the eight and one-third frames he hurled—and that was all the Reds got.

It was a dramatic game as Jim O'Leary, 23-year-old Cincinnati lefty, held the Giants in check until the ninth inning. Then a wind-blown ball to right betrayed him. Trailing by one run, as the result of a mental skull in the top of the ninth, the Giants came to their last bats with only four hits to their credit for the day.

Willie McCovey was lead-off man and he walked. Felipe Alou went in to run for him. Willie Mays bounced out, Alou going to second. Cepeda slammed a single to short, Alou holding second. Willie Kirkland then lofted a fly to right that Tony Gonzales dropped and all hands were safe. Jimmy Davenport, pinch hitting, fanned.

Bressoud Comes Through
Then, with two away, Eddie Bressoud, who sports a .241 batting average, lashed a 2-and-2 pitch into right center to send Alou and Cepeda streaming across the plate with the tying and winning runs.

The Giants nearly tossed the game away in the ninth. Billy Martin led off with a single off the tiring McCormick. He was erased on Vada Pinson's fielder's choice. But Eddie Kasko singled and Pinson went to third.

Rigney then came in to replace McCormick with Jones. Sam turned the trick and had two down. Then he went to sleep. Rigney came out to warn the boys to watch for a double steal. So Kasko streaks to second. Catcher Bob Schmidt faked a throw to second that Jones was supposed to cut off. But Sam ducked and the ball rolled harmlessly over second base as Pinson trotted in.

Kefauver Wanted as Watch Dog

Boston (UPI)—Sugar Ray Robinson wants Senator Estes Kefauver to be his "watch dog" during the return middleweight title fight with Paul Pender Friday night at Boston Garden.

George Gainford, Robinson's adviser, asked Kefauver by telegram today to watch the scheduled 15-round fight on television and decide whether it should be investigated. The senator is in Washington.

Kefauver (D-Tenn.) is head of the senate subcommittee that is preparing an inquiry into boxing to determine whether it needs federal control.

Robinson, of New York, claims that Pender, suburban Brookline, Mass., took the 160-pound crown New York and Massachusetts version from him on a hometown split decision at Boston last Jan. 22.

Adviser Gainford declared today: "Persistent rumors have convinced us that the stage is all set for another similar raw deal in the same ring if Pender is still on his feet at the finish."
