

Summer Session At Oregon State Has 350 Courses

Corvallis - Summer session at Oregon State college this year will offer more than 350 courses, workshops, seminars and institutes, according to Dr. F. R. Zerlan, dean of education and summer school director.

The regular eight-week session will run from June 20 to Aug. 12 with course offerings from art to modern languages and from music to zoology.

Workshops, seminars and institutes will be in agricultural education, business education, guidance, college and university teaching, home economics and natural resources. Workshops range from two to eight weeks, depending on the subject-matter concentration.

Summer School Programs
Three special graduate summer school programs for teachers of business subjects, industrial arts and science will be offered.

OSC's new school of humanities and social sciences will offer some 65 courses in art, economics, English, geography, history, journalism, modern languages, music, philosophy, political science, psychology, religion, sociology and speech.

Oregon students who are ineligible to enter Oregon State college by high school records may become eligible by earning a C average on nine quarter hours of credit in English composition and two other approved courses, Dean Zerlan said.

A summer recreation program will include week end tours to Silver Creek Falls State park, Timberline Lodge, the Oregon coast for deep-sea fishing, Cascade Plywood plant at Lebanon, central Oregon and Crater Lake.

Symington Urges Farmers to Keep Eye on Candidates

Albert Lea, Minn. - (UPI) - Sen. Stuart Symington (D-Mo.) says that farmers should keep an election-year eye peeled for "Johnny come lately" friends.

His comment was made in a speech at a farmers union picnic. He did not elaborate on what appeared to be a jibe at farm policies once espoused by Sen. John F. Kennedy (D-Mass.) and Vice President Richard M. Nixon.

Symington pressed his own campaign for the Democratic presidential nomination with a plea that farmers and others in rural communities "measure candidates not by their words alone, but by their deeds."

Symington, a member of the Senate agriculture committee, said "preservation of the family farm is the most important problem facing rural America."

Unless prompt action is taken to reverse present policies, he said, "we will see our agriculture economy dominated by huge integrated corporation-type farms."

He called for "a secretary of agriculture who truly represents and will work for the best interests of the family size farmer" plus a sound, comprehensive farm bill such as the one which he introduced last January.

Switch Raises or Lowers Windows

Cleveland - (UPI) - Pushbutton windows in automobiles are old stuff with M. D. Orlin of Suburban Shaker Heights. He has the same thing in his home.

Orlin, who holds several patents on window mechanisms, has produced a double hung window whose top sash lowers or rises with a flick of a switch.

A one-sixth horsepower motor is boxed into the top of the frame. A chain runs across the top of the window to threaded rods, one in each slide of the frame. Throw the switch and the rods turn the window down. Throw it again, and it goes up.

"It can be wired so that you could close it from a switch at your bedside," said Orlin. "And if the whole house is equipped with such windows, they all would be closed from a switch in the kitchen in case of a cloudburst."

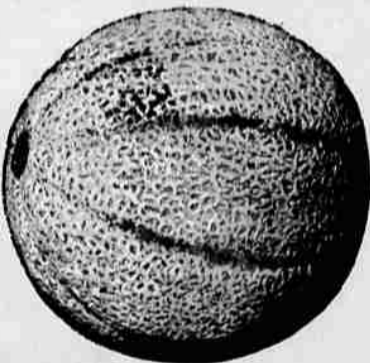
