Things That Cannot Be Seen With the X-Ray

Several hundred times a year people ask me why didn't their doctor x-ray their head to see if they had had a little stroke; or why didn't he x-ray their liver to see if they had hepatitis. The reason he did not make such studies is that I have shown him nothing. The x-rays can show us some things only when there is a difference in the opaqueness of a part of a tissue to the x-rays. For instance: if I were to put a piece of bread into the center of a loaf made of the same type of bread, and then were to x-ray the loaf, I would not be able to see the piece of bread I put in. But if I were to put my keys into the loaf and make an x-ray film, the keys would show up beautifully. Why? Because the passage of x-rays is so much greater than that of the bread. Fifty years ago I used to try hard with the x-rays to show the gallbladder, but I could not do it unless the bladder happened to be full of hard stones. Those I could easily see. Then, two old friends of mine, Drs. Graham and Cole devised a substance somewhat opaque to x-rays, which when given by mouth, would get so concentrated in the bile that the gallbladder would show up as a bright, pear-shaped shadow. Later, another dye was found which, when injected into a person, is so concentrated in the urine that the insides of the kidneys and bladder show up beautifully.

Cancers will not show up in a tissue until they produce changes such as a moth-eaten appearance in bones, or obstruction in the bowel, or ulceration in the stomach. To see a cancer in the stomach or bowel one gives a suspension of barium in water—by mouth or by enema.

Patient Rushed to Hospital

My secretary recently showed me a remarkable letter from a sad-widow who tells how, for years, her husband managed to get by with a bad heart. Then, on day, he went into his final attack. Without consulting with her or the family, the doctor rushed the dying man to a hospital where interns spent the next few hours pulling him around, examining him, sticking needles into him, listening to his heart and lungs, getting electrocardiograms, and giving him a lot of medicine. It is conceivable that all this strenuous effort turned the tide against him and shortened his life.

My old chief who was a fine heart specialist, used always to say to me, "When you find a man in an attack of heart failure leave him alone; don't fuss at him and tire him out; trust to morphine; that is the best medicine; if anything will save his life in his next few hours, a shot of morphine will." Many physicians will probably disagree with this, but I do know that under this treatment scores of my chief's patients recovered. I know that if I ever get a bad heart attack I hope I will be cared for by a wise physician who will leave me alone for a while.

A year or so ago I read an article by an able heart specialist who said that after studying a pile of hospital records of men with heart attacks, he doubted if many of the rushes through town in an ambulance had been necessary or even wise.
