Many Asians Jittery Over Eisenhower's Pending Visit

Tokyo — UPI — Many Asians are having second thoughts about the wisdom of President Eisenhower's visit to the Far East at this time.

There are almost certain to be major demonstrations in Tokyo by Communist-inspired students. And there are fears that Communist China might

seize upon the visit as an excuse for major action in the Formosa Strait.

Most Japanese are believed to welcome the Eisenhower visit. He is assured of a warm welcome here, in the Philippines, in South Korea and on Formosa. But some Asians fear the timing is bad.

When the Eisenhower visit

was first announced it was greeted with smiles of pleasure. Since then there has been the U-2 incident with accompanying Russian threats and the collapse of the summit conference — and more Russian threats.

It was obvious the Kremlin has sent word to its agents throughout the Far East to get busy and do anything possible to discredit the Eisenhower administration along the lines set forth by Premier Nikita Khrushchev's personal denunciations.

The President leaves Washington June 12 and flies to Alaska. He visits the Philippines June 14-16, Formosa June 18, Okinawa June 19 and Japan June 19-22. He makes an eight-hour visit to South Korea June 22 and flies to Honolulu for a rest before returning to Washington June 26.

The Communists were expected to try to stir up trouble whenever they can, especially in Tokyo. Balanced against that is the realization the President of the United States cannot permit the Communists to dictate his travel plans.

Things began going wrong on April 19 when thousands of students began their demonstrations against the government of President Syngman Rhee and forced his resignation to begin an era

of political uncertainty. Exactly a month later, on May 19, after 107 days of deliberation, Japan's Prime Minister Nobusuke Kishi pushed through passage of a U.S.-Japanese security treaty in a parliament so torn with dissension that at one point the Socialists held the house speaker prisoner.

Leftists have organized angry demonstrations daily. There were "Ike stay home" placards and demands that Kishi resign. The leftists plan new demonstrations when Eisenhower arrives — on June 19, the day the treaty goes into effect.

Here was the situation in the other countries Eisenhower will visit:

Formosa: One of the friendliest welcomes of the entire tour expected from Nationalist officials and President Chiang Kai-shek. The United States is committed to the defense of Formosa and there are no major outstanding differences between the two governments.

The Philippines: It will be a three-day homecoming for Eisenhower, who served in the Philippines as a major under Gen. Douglas MacArthur and an all-out welcome was expected with Eisenhower addressing Congress and a rally of one million Filipinos.

Okinawa: This bastion in the Ryukyu Islands has become the United States biggest base in the Far East and servicemen are expected to turn out by the thousands with nothing but smiles for their commander in chief. However a handful of native leftists have planned minor demonstrations against con-

tinued U.S. control of Okinawa.

South Korea: Eisenhower's visit three days before the 10th anniversary of the outbreak of war between South Korea and the Communist North finds the nation in serious trouble. The student riots which forced the fall of the Syngman Rhee government have left political chaos behind. The 650,000-man Korean army is reported riddled with dissension with younger officers already forcing out their senior officers who were mixed up in the Rhee administration. Eisen-
