

Ninth Inning Rally Gives Cards 7-6 Win Over Pirates; Giants Lose

The St. Louis Cardinals knocked off the first place Pittsburgh Pirates for the second consecutive day Saturday, pulling out a 7-6 victory in the last of the ninth.

Bob Nieman's two-run double off reliever Erloy Face with the bases loaded was the decisive blow, giving the Cardinals' third relief hurler, Bob Dilliba, his fourth victory in six decisions.

Ken Boyer and Daryl Spencer hit homers for the Cards while Dick Stuart belted a two-run homer for the Pirates. The Pirates were leading, 6-4, going into the last of the ninth, having broken a 4-4 tie in the seventh inning on Stuart's two-run home run. But the Cards finished off with a flood of hits.

Bill White led off with a single as rain began to fall, but defensive substitute Bill Virdon made a brilliant, one-handed running catch to rob Curt Flood of an extra base hit in deep center.

Yanks Beat Indians; Narrow League Lead

The New York Yankees climbed to within one and one-half games of first place in the American League Saturday by downing the jittery Cleveland Indians, 6-4.

The Indians defeat dropped them behind the Baltimore Orioles, who downed Kansas City in a night game, 6-5 in 10 innings.

Pinch-hitter Elston Howard delivered the crushing blow in the seventh inning off reliever Johnny Klippstein, making his 14th relief appearance of the season.

Howard belted his two-run homer after catcher John Romano and Klippstein were uncertain who was going to handle Bobby Richardson's bunt. Romano made a late grab for the ball but bobbed it.

Roger Maris and Yogi Berra also hit home runs for the Yankees while Johnny Temple smashed his first American league homer for the Indians.

Maris the major league's leading home run hitter, belted his 17th of the season, surpassing his entire output for the 1959 season.

Relief ace Ryne Duren picked up his second win in three decisions this year for the Yankees.

Ted Williams hit the 497th homer of his career but it was Vic Wertz' two-run homer that pulled out a 5-4 victory for Boston over Chicago in the first game of a day-night doubleheader.

Williams' two-run homer, which came off Early Wynn, was a 420-foot blast and his fifth round tripper this year. Don Buddin also homered for the Red Sox.

Wertz hit his blast in the eighth inning off Gerry Staley, in his 22nd relief stint. Staley picked up his second loss against six victories. Gene Freese belted a solo smash for the White Sox.

The victory was interim Manager Del Baker's first in five tries.
