THE MANY WORLDS OF BILL HOLDEN (Continued)

Government \$17,000. It took him seven years, till 1952, to pay it off.

The following year he was back in debt. He owed Uncle Sam \$35,000 and needed a bank loan to square things.

"The World of Suzie Wong" is the first picture Bill has made for which he doesn't have to pay American taxes. But in spite of assuring him \$500,000 against 10 percent of the gross, it won't put him on Easy Street. "As a resident of Switzerland, I have to pay taxes of whatever country I work in. In England (where parts of "Suzie" were filmed) the highest bracket happens to be 96 percent."

THIS, INCIDENTALLY, should dispel another myth—that Holden went to Switzerland primarily to avoid paying taxes.

There are two reasons for his change of residence. "First of all," Bill says, "Switzerland is no longer 8,000 miles from Hollywood. Today, Hollywood is at least 8,000 miles from the rest of the world. I haven't made a picture there for years, even when I lived in California!

"Second, I am within five minutes walk-

ing distance of my boys' school. And I didn't send my boys to Switzerland because I moved there: I moved there because I feel they can get a better education there than in the United States. When they finish high school in Lausanne at 18, they'll get credit for 60 college units in the United States. That should speak for itself!"

What will the future hold for Bill?

"When I'm not in pictures, I'll divide my time between Switzerland, Kenya, and Hong Kong. I'll concentrate on expanding the African wild-life preserve, on my business enterprises, on making friends. I have an awful lot of acquaintances right now but few real friends because I'm never in one place long enough.

"Most of all, I'll stay as far away from acting as I can, because I hate to get up early in the morning, to study my lines at night, to waste time hanging around the set for hours when there are so many other things I could be doing. Honestly, I just don't like being an actor any more!"

Bill Holden was dead serious.

But I watched his wife's expression and thought I detected a smile.
