

### Cancer Rate Found To Vary In Hawaiians

New York - (Science Service) - The several racial groups in Hawaii have varying susceptibility to cancer, Dr. Walter B. Quisenberry of the State Department of Health in Honolulu reported here today.

He told a conference on culture, society and health here that incidence of stomach cancer in Hawaii is highest among Japanese men. Primary cancer of the liver is most frequent in Filipino men, possibly because the diets of Filipino men are higher in carbohydrates and lower in protein and vitamin B-1 than those of other ethnic groups.

Cancer of the nasopharynx occurs most often in the Chinese. Dr. Quisenberry said this may be due to irritation from hot liquids such as tea. Filipino and Japanese men have the lowest incidence of lung cancer in Hawaii. These men have probably smoked fewer cigarettes over the years than Caucasian men, Dr. Quisenberry said.

The breast cancer rate is now five times higher among Caucasian than among Japanese women. Japanese women have been slower in giving up the nursing of their children. The rate seems to be increasing as the Japanese women stop nursing babies.

Caucasian women have cancer of the large intestine more frequently than any other ethnic group.

Cancer of the uterine cervix is most frequent among Hawaiian and part-Hawaiian women. Dr. Quisenberry said this may be because Hawaiians probably do not receive as good care following pregnancies as women in other groups.

Caucasian men have cancer of the prostate gland about nine times more frequently than Japanese men. This may be due to differences in the lovemaking and mating habits, Dr. Quisenberry said.

He added that some of the ethnic differences in the frequency of cancer may disappear with the integration of racial groups in Hawaii.

### Rep. Porter Asks Study Be Scheduled On Shoe Labeling

Washington—Rep. Charles O. Porter (D-Ore.) has requested the House Interstate and foreign commerce subcommittee on commerce and finance to schedule a full study next year on shoe labeling legislation. Porter testified before the subcommittee today.

He explained, "I am not here to argue the merits of the case. The pros and cons cannot be explained in an hour or two. I am hopeful that when this study is undertaken there will be ample time for proponents and opponents of this legislation to testify before you in detail."

Porter introduced his shoe labeling bill Jan. 7, 1959. Endorsements of the legislation have come from the National Grange, the National Farmers Union, the American National Cattlemen's Association and many consumers. The Oregon representative showed the committee samples of signed petitions in support of shoe labeling he had received from Pennsylvania consumers.

He also reported that residents of the Fourth Congressional District of Oregon had endorsed shoe labeling in an

opinion poll vote of Yes—16,476 to No—2,033. "I feel it is pretty clear that consumers would like to know from what materials their shoes are made," he said.

#### FTC Investigation

The Congressman explained that the federal trade commission currently is conducting an extensive preliminary investigation "to comprehend specific and detailed consideration of the labeling and advertising of three particular shoe manufacturers." Porter said "I know for a fact that the investigation is progressing. I am in touch with the agency from time to time, the most recent occasion being June 3, 1960, when the project for the agency observed that the FTC was 'investigating to ascertain whether there are deceptive practices.'" In his testimony Porter commended the FTC.

He said he had no special interest other than "that the consumer be protected." Porter said his interest in shoe labeling had come initially from his conversations with Wilbur Gardner, a shoe repairman in Medford, Ore.

### Benson Cautiously Steps Toward Nixon Bandwagon

Washington—(UPI) - Secretary of Agriculture Ezra Taft Benson has taken cautious steps toward the Republican presidential band wagon of Richard M. Nixon, it has been disclosed.

Benson has indicated he is ready to campaign for the vice president—after the July nominating convention in Chicago if Nixon is the nominee, as now seems certain.

Benson and Nixon have been at loggerheads on national farm policy. The reason for Benson's change was the anti-Nixon statement issued by New York Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller last week. Rockefeller accused Nixon of fence-straddling on major election issues and called on him to tell the voters where he stands.

#### Withdrew From Race

Rockefeller withdrew from the GOP presidential race last December but his statement and other recent events indicate he may reconsider.

A close friend of the controversial Benson told United Press International the secretary was "a little disturbed" by the Rockefeller statement. "He can't go along with all of it," the friend said. "Rockefeller swung so far to the left that Nixon might be a better choice for the nomination."

The informant did not go into specifics. But Benson was represented as believing now that Nixon, in spite of his silence on overall farm policy, "will come around basically to what the Eisenhower administration stands for."

"Of course," the friend said, "he (Nixon) may put a new face on it, but if the basic fundamentals are there, Benson will support him."

### Eisenhower to Find Different Manila On Far East Visit

Manila - (UPI) - President Eisenhower's visit to the Philippines today through Thursday, will be one big three-day homecoming celebration.

Whatever the current Philippine-American problems—and there are several—there were no apparent plans to bring them up here for discussion with the American President.

The problem in neighboring Japan may be anti-American demonstrations during his visit; the problem here is holding back the mass of Eisenhower admirers and old friends.

Eisenhower served in the Philippines as an aide to Gen. Douglas MacArthur in the late 1930s as an army major and later as a lieutenant colonel. Constant Question

And he may be surprised to learn how popular he was those two decades ago. Manila newspapers have been running front page accounts of his career in the Philippines—usually MacArthur pictures with Ike in the background. And he is expected to run into a constant question: "Mr. President, don't you remember me?"

Present plans call for Eisenhower to address the Philippine Congress which will be called back into special session and to address an expected 1,000,000 Filipinos at a giant rally in Manila.

He may visit Bataan and Corregidor. If he plays golf, it probably would be at the mountain resort town of Baguio, about a 45-minute plane ride from Manila.

Eisenhower will hit Manila's hottest season, and when it is hot here it is very hot. Also humid. Barring an unexpected typhoon the temperatures will be well above 100.

#### Different Manila

Eisenhower will see a far different Manila than he knew in the 1930's. The famed old Spanish section, walled by 400-year-old fort, was destroyed in the 1944 battle of Manila. In its place is a booming modern city which towers above the old Spanish churches, canals and walls.

Most people think Manila is the capital of the Philippines but legally it is Quezon

City, an eastern suburb. There are about 24,000,000 Filipinos.

The Philippines are made up of 7,100 islands, most of them less than a mile square. The biggest are Luzon, where Manila is located, and Mindanao. Manila Bay is the finest harbor in the Far East and the Spanish fleet in 1898.

### Soviet Newspaper Backs Khrushchev

Moscow - (UPI) - A second Soviet newspaper has sharply criticized "left-wing extremism" in the Communist movement and reaffirmed Premier Nikita Khrushchev's policy of dealing with the West.

The official Communist newspaper Pravda attacked the trend Sunday. A similar attack was carried in the newspaper Soviet Russia, official organ of the Russian Republic, on Friday.

Neither article mentioned Communist China by name. There was no hint in either,

however, that such left-wing heresies are advocated in this country.

In the West, they are interpreted as criticism of Communist China's opposition to Khrushchev's efforts to ease the cold war by meeting and dealing with Western leaders.

### United Jetliner Damaged in Landing

Chicago - (UPI) - A United Air Lines jet airliner broke a nose wheel on landing at O'Hare International Airport today and nosed over into heavy mud off the runway.

Authorities said none of the 41 passengers or seven crew members was hurt.

The plane, United's flight 855 from New York's Idlewild Field en route to Los Angeles International Airport, was attempting an instrument landing in heavy rain when the accident occurred.

**Herter Complains Of Demands Being Made on Time**  
Washington - (UPI) - Secretary of State Christian A. Herter complains that too many people want to see him in too many places—at overseas conferences, airport receptions for foreign visitors, diplomatic dinners and congressional hearings.  
The much-traveled Herter said his required attendance at a growing number of meetings abroad was getting to be "a very real problem." He suggested that he and other foreign ministers hold fewer conferences and let their subordinates carry on negotiations through normal diplomatic channels.  
156 Days Outside U.S.  
Herter, testifying before a Senate subcommittee studying foreign policy machinery, said he had spent 156 of his 414 days as secretary outside the United States.  
His predecessor, the late John Foster Dulles, also flew to all corners of the globe to confer with world leaders. Dulles carried a little notebook in which he recorded the distances of his numerous trips.  
Series of Demands  
Herter painted his life as Secretary of State as an unceasing series of demands on his time.  
He described as "extremely time consuming" his talks of greeting visiting foreign dignitaries at the airport and attending diplomatic banquets.  
He said the time was coming when nations would have to discuss ways of curbing these functions.  
With a smile he added, "a good many committees of Congress are not satisfied with an Undersecretary of State as a witness." Committee members joined the speculator in laughing at that sly dig.
