Editors Note: The Family Council consists of a Judge, a psychiatrist, three clergymen, a newspaper editor, a women's editor and two writers. Each article is a summary of an actual case history. The Council reports on problems that have been dealt with by responsible agencies and counselors.

Mickey L. - Betty is too cold.
Betty M. - He's too unrestrained.

Mickey L. - I am 19 and in my first year of college. I've gone out quite a lot socially but have never cared seriously about anyone until I met Betty a few months ago.

Betty is nearly 18, but hasn't dated very much and is much too shy and restrained. She is really a very attractive girl and could be knockout if only she'd warm up a little.

To get down to cases - I see no harm in holding hands during a date or a little cuddling and kissing just for goodnight. I don't mean a heavy petting and I wouldn't be guilty of any ungentlemanly behavior toward Betty. But I certainly don't like her shoving me away as if I were poison when I try to warm up to her. I feel I can help her develop warmth toward the opposite sex - if she'd give me a chance.

Betty M. - I guess I could say just the opposite about Mickey of what he says about me.

I like him very much and I feel he could be a wonderful companion - if only he'd learn a little more restraint. He is constantly reaching for my hand, giving me a little hugs and pats or touching my face or hair. He says it's nothing at all, but I just don't like it.

It's true that Mickey has never been exactly ungentlemanly, but he can be annoying. I have discussed this with other girls and they agree with him that I am too cold and I'm going to have trouble in later life, but my mother says to save the loving for the one I love. Of course, Mom is stodgy about those things and I guess I inherit it from her. Is it serious?

The Council: It's very easy for teen-agers to railroad one another into attitudes completely against their real inclinations. These are the years when they most want to be liked - both by the crowd and one individual of the opposite sex.

We therefore admire Betty for having a clear understanding of her own feelings and enough self-confidence to speak for them. Probably her good, honest relationship with her mother has a lot to do with that.

We urge Betty not to be intimidated by what boys and other girls tell her. Her dislike of too free and casual physical contacts is no sign

Ben-Gurion Arrives In Paris for Talks

Paris - (AP) - Israeli Premier David Ben-Gurion arrived for talks with President Charles de Gaulle and a possible later meeting with Argentine President Arturo Frondizi to discuss the Adolf Eichmann case.

Ben-Gurion's four-day visit was planned long before Israel's capture of the former Nazi colonel in Argentina strained its relations with that country but the Eichmann affair was expected to figure prominently in the de Gaulle-Ben-Gurion talks.

French political sources ruled out suggestions that de Gaulle might step in as mediator in the dispute.

New Aviation Firm Started at Airport

Cantaloupe Tips Now in Booklet

Corvallis - Detailed information on growing cantaloupes in home gardens as well as commercially is given in a new circular published by the Oregon State college extension service.

Cantaloupes are widely grown on commercial acreages and in home gardens over the state, the new circular says. It then suggests best varieties to grow, type of soil needed, and best cultural

and harvesting practices. The new circular is titled, "Growing Cantaloupes in Oregon." It was written by Andrew A. Duncan and R. Ralph Clark, extension horticulturists at OSC.

Oregon residents may obtain a free copy at their county extension office, or from the OSC bulletin clerk, Corvallis.

Hartford, Conn.—An insurance company reports that its average "life insurance millionaire" is a man, 44 years old, with a wife and children and a good job as a business executive.

The company studied the background of its 37 policyholders whose lives are insured for \$1 million or more. Ages range from 30 to 59, all but four are men, and more than half are involved in manufacturing, finance, investment or real estate.

Three of the women are housewives with business interests, and the fourth is an executive of a publishing firm.

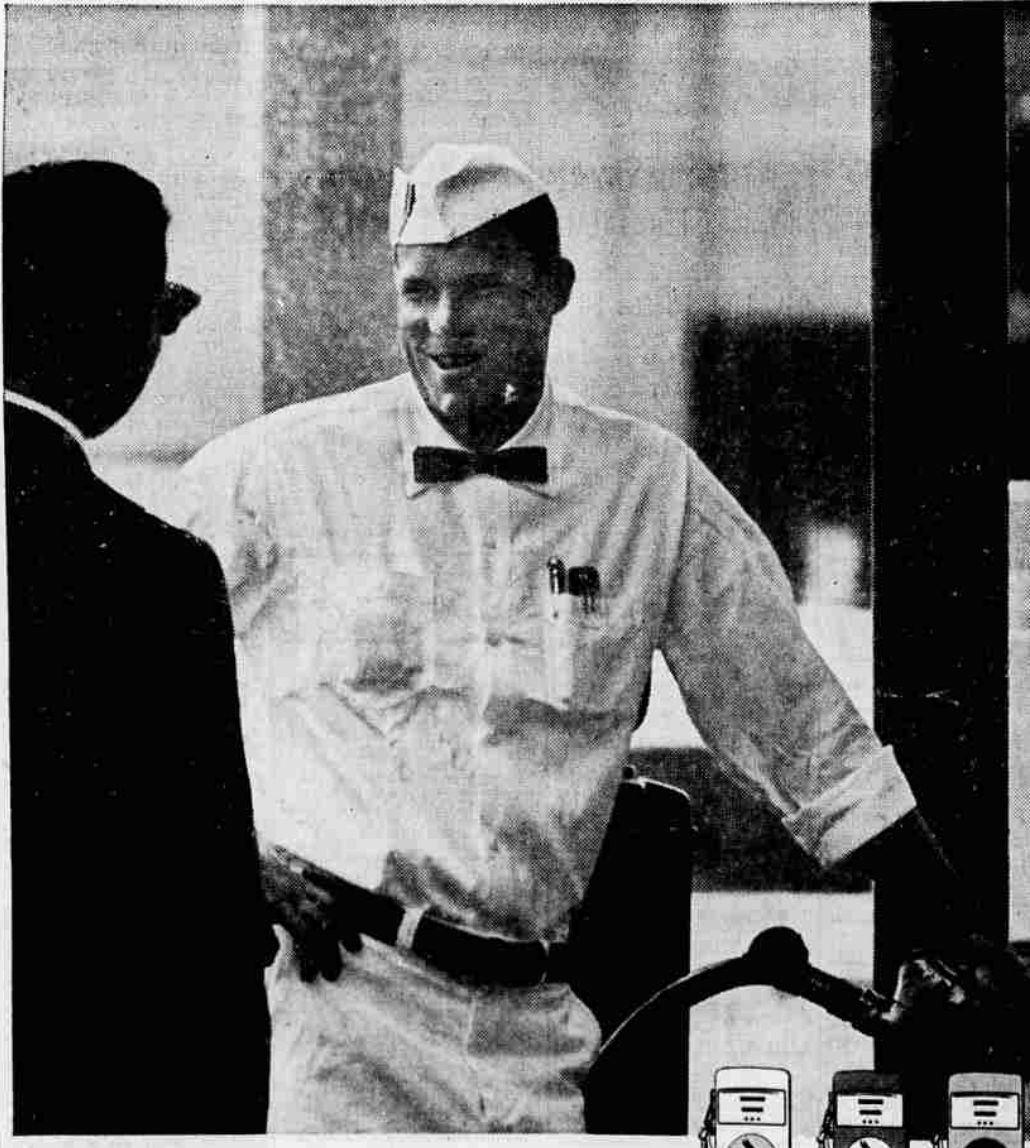
