Sixty County 4-H Club Members To Leave for School

Sixty Jackson county 4-H'ers will leave Medford Saturday morning to attend the annual 4-H club summer school at Oregon State college in Corvallis, according to Glenn Klein, Jackson county 4-H club agent.

Chosen on the basis of 4-H achievement and leadership, the 4-H'ers will represent Jackson county as they participate with almost 2,000 4-H'ers from the rest of Oregon in a week's study in home economics, agriculture and related sciences.

The purpose of the school is to supplement regular 4-H project work. Club members will attend five days of classes and assemblies beginning at 8:30 a.m. each day and ending at 4:20 p.m. In addition to subject matter classes, recreation, art, beginning and advanced swimming, gymnastics, football, softball, folk dancing, band and chorus will be included in some class programs.

Delegates will be housed in college dormitories, fraternities, sororities and cooperative houses. This gives 4-H'ers a chance to live with and learn from 4-H'ers from other sections of Oregon.

Several special features are included in the program including a 4-H Sunday Service conducted by the club members. Philip Krouse of Applegate will give the closing message.
