Family Council

Editor's Note: The Family Council consists of a judge, a psychiatrist, three clergymen, a newspaper editor, a women's editor and two writers. Each article is a summary of an actual case history. The Council reports on problems that have been dealt with by responsible agencies and counselors.

Isabel R. — My father hits me.

Mrs. L. R. — She's getting to be a problem child.

Isabel R. — I am 15 and miserable at home because I can't get along with anyone in my family—especially my father.

My mother and my kid brother are against me, but the worst is my father. He smacks me around for the least thing I do. If I come home late from a date, he yells at my boy friend and slaps me in front of him. I can't hold my head up among my friends any more.

I really hate my father and feel I might go crazy if I go on living at home. I know my aunt would let me come to live with her if my mother would allow it. But my mother screams at me whenever I mention it.

Mrs. L. R. — Isabel is really getting to be a problem child and we don't know what to do with her. She seems full of hate for all of us.

It is true that her father has hit her on occasion, but he has never really mistreated her. He has hit her when she talked fresh to him and me. He hit her only once in front of a boy friend and that time she yelled at him when he spoke to her and the boy about coming in late.

It's true that my sister might be willing to take Isabel for a while, but I feel her place is home with her own family. My sister is burdened with four youngsters of her own.

The Council: Mrs. L. R. is right about the fact that Isabel's place is with her family, but she should be aware that a temporary change of environment often brings many emotional benefits.

Isabel is evidently going through a painful period of adolescent stress and probably has little control over her tongue or her actions. Her fiery explosions rouse her father's anger and Isabel, feeling she has merited hatred from him, insists that she is the one who hates.

At bottom, Isabel, like all girls, desires love and appreciation from her family — particularly her father. She and her father have now formed a habit or pattern of interchange that simply doesn't allow a breakthrough of the love they undoubtedly have for one another.

We don't think hitting is often a good form of punishment. Too frequently it gives the parent the feeling that misbehavior has been dealt with when it has merely been shoved aside for the moment. A constantly misbehaving child is having trouble inside himself and it is the parent's responsibility to find out what it is.

Hitting is a particularly poor kind of punishment in dealing with adolescents. Pride is a big point with them. Teen-agers want so much to be grown up that it hurts deeply when their parents treat them like children. It is especially important for an adolescent girl to feel that her father considers her an attractive and lovable young lady. Mr. L. R. could win his daughter's love and respect and mold her into a happy, loving woman if he would praise her whenever and for whatever he can. He should be stern about dating hours, but avoid humiliating Isabel or creating a crisis about the subject.

A temporary separation may prepare the ground for a new relationship.
