The program, to be held June 21 to 24, is designed to train summer fire control employees in fire detection, smoke chasing, fire behavior, and fire-fighting.

The group, made up of lookouts, fire patrolmen, and fire suppression crewmen will receive both classroom and actual field training.

### Amusement Machines To Be Licensed July 1

Starting July 1, owners and operators of mechanical amusement machines will have to take out city licenses which were formerly issued only for pinball machines, Medford City Attorney Joel Reeder said Friday.

The licenses will cost \$100 or \$1,500 depending on ownership of the machine.

The owner of a machine who has the machine on his own premises will have to pay a \$100 license fee per machine. The owner of a machine which is located on property owned by another person will have to pay \$1,500 for an operator's license. The \$1,500 license entitles the operator to own up to 50 machines.

These are the same prices formerly charged for pinball machine licenses only. Reeder said that under the Medford code the definition of machines to be considered un-

### Cordy Returns From Eugene Conference

Jackson County Horticultural Agent Clifford B. Cordy returned Thursday from a meeting of the western section of the American Institute on Biological Sciences in Eugene where a half day was spent on pear decline.

"Although we learned some things that helped us with our study of the pear decline problem in the Rogue valley, there was nothing there radically new to us," Cordy said Friday. "Pooling of such information, however, is always helpful."

Some soil fungus has been discovered working on ornamental plants, Cordy explained. Some of the same trouble has been found in pear orchards, the horticultural agent said. Although cultural methods used were not discovered as detrimental earlier they did favor the comparative recent development of soil fungus, Cordy said.

The decline problem also involves the improper use of water and fertilizer, he added. Several local orchards have shown material improvement through use of new practices recommended by the research team here. However, in Washington trees with the graft decline have never recovered, he noted.
