

Latter-day Saints Establish Two Wards in Medford Area

The Medford ward of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints was divided into two wards at a ward conference Sunday, June 19. Carroll W. Smith, Ashland, Klamath stake president, presided at the event.

The establishing of a second ward in Medford was made on the recommendation of stake officers and approval of the general church authorities in Salt Lake City. Membership in the Medford ward had reached 1,000 members, it was reported, which necessitated the division.
