Electronic Monitors To Check 'Bluebird'

London — (UPI) — Electronic monitors will keep an automatic eye on Donald Campbell's turbojet car "Bluebird" to help minimize the hazards of driving around 400 miles-an-hour when he streaks across the Utah salt flats this year in a bid to crack the world land speed record.

Measuring equipment developed by the aircraft industry will give continuous readings of strain, pressures and temperatures from 23 different parts of the vehicle and radio results back to a base receiver.

Japanese Farmer Wants To Install California Ideas

Niihara, Japan — (UPI) — Ever since Ichie Honda returned to Japan from a three-year stint as a worker on a California farm he has been torn between the new ideas he learned in the United States and the traditions of his village.

The 30-year-old Honda is referred to as one of the "new farmers" in his native Niihara village. The California sunshine and plenty of wholesome food he enjoyed in Orange county, Calif., have made him look in village eyes like a "new" man.

But the changes in Honda go much deeper than that. "I really do not know how to explain my feelings," he said.

"I have more than one million yen (\$2,780) now. I know that it would take a farmer here more than 20 years to have this much money. But \$3,000 to an American worker is just a new automobile. A Japanese farmer working for the same length of time would eye a new bicycle. That's all he could afford.

"But now I'm afraid of money. The idea of wealth frightens me."

Honda, speaking with the drawl of the heavy Japanese rural dialect, said he was now working on a village levee construction project as a day laborer.

Wearing a khaki shirt and blue dungarees, he sat on the lacquered veranda of his thatched-roof house in Guma Prefecture. The twittering of chickadees and the murmuring of streams could be distinctly heard in the clear mountain air.

"Now I get only 350 yen (97 cents) for working eight hours a day," Honda said. "I was making much more than this per hour in the states."

Honda rubbed his blistered hands.

All Work on Farm
He, with his elderly parents, three brothers and three sisters, all work the farm's four acres containing a rice paddy, a mulberry field and land for vegetables, oats, wheat and other crops.

The Hondas also own 10 acres of forest land and a few domestic animals — a work cow, a milking goat, two pigs, a dozen rabbits and 20 chickens. The family consumes three-quarters of all they produce and sell the remainder to the city markets through the village co-operative association. Last year the family income totalled 350,000 yen (\$972).

"Our low economic status can be greatly improved by introducing national thinking in our village life," Honda said.

He said he planned to buy a garden tractor (cost: \$500). "But before I get the machine I must step up the volume of work in two or three crops to lower expenses," he said. "We are now growing more than 20 different kinds of crops on this small piece of land."

To Buy More Land
He said he will spend the rest of his American savings for more farm land.

"Naturally I want to get a television set, a refrigerator, a washing machine for my family and a motorcycle for myself," he said. "But I will have to wait until I profit from my 'modernized' farm management."

Honda said many other of his fellow villagers have been mechanizing their farms.
