### The Family Council

Editor's Note: The Family Council consists of a Judge, a psychiatrist, three clergymen, a newspaper editor, a women's editor and two writers. Each article is a summary of an actual case history. The Council reports on problems that have been dealt with by responsible agencies and counselors.

**Martin J.** — It would be disloyal of us to share the house with Roger.

**Ethel J.** — His wife says she doesn't consider it disloyal.

**Martin J.** — My wife and I are in our mid-20s and have a year-old daughter. This season we took a summer cottage with a young couple who have been our friends for several years.

When we got out there, we were surprised to find Roger living there by himself. He said he and his wife have separated and are planning to get a divorce. He is planning to live at the cottage while his wife will remain in the city apartment.

Ethel was supposed to be at the cottage during the week and I would come out week ends. I don't feel it's right for her to keep house for Roger — which is what she would be doing. Besides, it's not loyal to Roger's wife, who was our friend before she married Roger.

**Ethel J.** — I was worried about the matter of loyalty at first, but I discussed it with Marian, Roger's wife. She told me she really didn't care what we did about the cottage, but she definitely would not consider it disloyal of us to keep up a friendship with Roger.

As for the housework, all I know is I'm not going to do any of it for Roger. He'll have to take care of his own room and do his share of shopping, etc. If I'm cooking it means nothing for me to cook for another person.

I feel that Martin is creating issues where none really exist. It's too late to change our plans and we'll be stuck in the hot city all summer if

we don't take this place. We can't afford a place of our own.

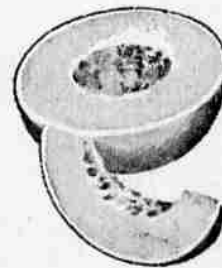
