At Glacier National Park (a most unattractive spot at this season of the year) the national governors are holding their 32nd annual Governors conference.

What are they conferring about? The answer seems to be contained in one word: **POLITICS.**

**FOR example** Governor Nelson Rockefeller of New York told his assembled fellow governors that the Eisenhower administration is "seeking unrealistic deals with a bargain basement defense program that needs immediate expansion."

**HOW?** He said we need more missiles. We need wider dispersal of our offensive weapons. We need an airborne alert of SAC (Strategic Air Command) planes. He proposed an increase in army, marine and navy strength.

He said the relative military power of the U. S., as compared with that of the Soviet Union, has steadily and drastically declined over the past 15 years. (In 1945, 15 years ago, we had The Bomb, and the Russians didn't. Now the Russians have it, too.)

He added: "These actions will cost us money as well as fresh efforts of intelligence and imagination." He called for an immediate up of three and a half billions in military spending.

**HE MAY** be right . . . although, of course, one might wish he had told us how we could offset the \$15 billion needed for more defense by cutting out \$15 billion of WASTE, of which there is plenty in our federal government.

Military perils aren't the only perils. History is full of the perils of national bankruptcy. Most of the great nations that have fallen since history was first written have fallen because they got so deeply in debt they couldn't pull out.

**SO MUCH** for Mr. Rockefeller and the Republican governors. While he was providing most of the GOP news, the delegates tell us, four Democratic favorite son presidential candidates were meeting to talk over the presidential convention situation. Their session, they explained, was NOT a stop-Kennedy movement. The purpose, they said, was merely to set up machinery to make certain that Mr. Kennedy wouldn't be nominated on the first ballot at Los Angeles.

**WHAT** is to say: Mr. Rockefeller wants MORE CANDIDATES at the GOP convention in Chicago. Everybody in the Democratic camp but Mr. Kennedy wants more candidates at the Democratic convention at Los Angeles.

Both are laudable desires. Nobody should be handed a presidential nomination on a silver platter. Competition in politics, as in business, is a part of the American way. It's good, rather than bad.

**BUT** let's get back to the governor's convention.

The business of governors is to administer the affairs of their STATES. Yet . . . here at their 32nd annual conference . . . we find them at a most EXCLUSIVELY concerned with NATIONAL politics including who is going to be struck by the political lightning at the two big national conventions.

**IN CONCLUSION**

One governor confided to a reporter that he had counted 28 governors who came to the conference in National Guard aircraft. He added that so far as he knew all had been accompanied by more persons than just their wives and executive aides.

I think most of us taxpayers think it would have been better if the governors and their unavoidably necessary aides had made the trip to this highly POLITICAL conference (held at a very pleasant summer resort) by commercial plane . . . or by private automobile . . . or by rail.
