**Hail, Hearty Frankfurters on Week End Menus**  
The hail and hearty frankfurter is a tremendously popular item for a long week end; it is one of our very best buys. It's little wonder that this special meat item enjoys such popularity for it can be combined with many other delicious foods.

Most frankfurters will wind up in the popular "red hot" with broiler franks running a close second. Other favored ways, designed for fork eating, are these:

Try franks baked with a stuffing of mashed potatoes, grated cheese and onion.

Another good down-to-earth dish is sauerkraut topped with franks and heated to tangy goodness.

Surprise friends and family with a late evening snack of hot franks in buns topped with a sauce made from three parts cranberry sauce and one part horseradish.

The realm of the casserole finds sliced franks adding wonderful flavor and solid nutrition to macaroni and cheese, to canned baked beans and to scalloped potatoes.

Skillet specially for four persons comes to table in skillet. Slice three medium tomatoes one-half inch thick into skillet. Top with thin slices of one onion and strips of one green pepper. Slice six franks in half, first lengthwise, then slashwise and place on vegetables. Cover and cook slowly about 15 minutes. Sprinkle one cup shredded cheese over; salt and pepper, then cover. Turn off heat. Cheese will melt. Everyone will like.

**Dairy Products.** Extra supplies needed. More milk for the children, more butter for corn-on-cob and baked potatoes, more half and half or coffee cream for those gallons of coffee; cream for berries and for peaches. Extra ice cream, ice milk or other frozen desserts which are surprisingly low priced. Ice cream cones for the children.

Quick reminders as space permits. Extra mayonnaise, mustard, pickles. Potatoes for potato salad, corn-on-cob, baking potatoes. Lemonade makings and other beverages, both canned and bottled. You'll want other melons, fresh fruits, berries; salad makings galore.
