New Trailer Park Ordinance Prepared by City Planners

A new trailer park ordinance for the city of Medford has been prepared by the city's planning office and has been submitted to members of the city council and planning commission for their consideration.

The proposed ordinance, which would replace the existing trailer park ordinance, was prepared by the planning office in conjunction with the planning commission.

The project came under the joint city-federal urban planning assistance program and is part of a general revision of all of Medford's existing zoning ordinances.

Public Hearings

The new trailer park ordinance will not be adopted by the city until public hearings have been called before both the planning commission and city council. No date has yet been set for these hearings.

Recreation Space

7. Recreation space within the trailer park shall include a minimum of 100 square feet for each trailer space within four years. Each recreation area shall have a minimum of 1,000 square feet.

Include Health Rules

The planning office has also proposed that the ordinance include the rules and regulations of the Oregon state board of health relating to trailers.

Former Sheriff To Prepare Beef for Groundbreaking

Crescent City—"Enjoyment of mountain scenery and tasty barbecued beef" will be featured when the first shovel of earth is turned July 8 to inaugurate construction of the Oregon Mountain tunnel project, according to the Del Norte County Chamber of Commerce.

The beef will be prepared by Austin (Bud) Huffman, former sheriff of the county.

The program will be held on the summit of Oregon mountain on the Redwood Highway near the California-Oregon state line. The site provides a view into Smith river canyon.

The ceremonies will start at 3 p.m. with the Rev. Gordon Byars of Foursquare church delivering the invocation. Singing of the national anthem, led by Gerald Clausen, will be followed by the introduction of guests.

Scheduled to Talk

Representatives of the Oregon, Nevada and California Highway commissions are scheduled to address the audience. Sam Helwer, district engineer, District 1, California division of highways, under whose direction the tunnel will be built; California Highway Patrol Commissioner Bradford M. Crittenden; and California Director of Public Works Robert Bradford will speak for their organizations.

Don Emerson, president of the Redwood Empire association, will point up the importance of the tunnel to the people along the routes within their territories.

The mutual interests of Nevada, Oregon and California in the use of the tunnel will be symbolized in mingling of samples of earth from their respective states by Nevada's Frank Bengochea, chairman, Humboldt County Board of County Commissioners; Oregon's Judge Raymond A. Lathrop, Josephine County court; and California's Fred Haight, chairman, Del Norte county board of supervisors.

Turning the first shovel of earth will be California State Senator Randolph Colmer, who has been the prime mover in having the project adopted.

Following the meet, barbecued beef will be served. Visitors will find binoculars at their disposal at various points.

Fly Had Fatal Flaw - Could Only Fly Upside Down

He had not the slightest idea of what the trouble was. The poor little sap wasn't conscious of the fact that one (maybe both) of his halteres was out of kilter; that his tiny, complicated gyrostabilizer was failing to function, causing him to fly in an upside down position.
