A non-league engagement on Wednesday evening will have Medford against Klamath Falls No. 2 at Memorial field White City.

Klamath Falls and Central Point American Legion Junior baseball clubs, pace-setters in the southern division of Area 4, fortified their respective first and second place spots with victories on Friday.

Klamath, with five-hit hurling by John Webb and Wally Palmberg and a four-run fourth inning, won 7 to 1 over a Medford team which had trouble "hitting" em where they ain't.

Central Point, with 11 hits, the help of 12 bases on balls and stellar one-hit relief hurling by Bill Anhorn, who struck out 15, dumped Grants Pass 12 to 3.

The KF aggregation's big scoring frame was on just one hit, a single by Dick DePew, who had three safe blows for the evening. Also figuring in the four markers were two hit batters, a base on balls, an error and John Bianchi's sacrifice fly.

Leahy Resigns Charger Post; Hospitalized

Chicago (UPI)—Frank Leahy, once great coach of Notre Dame who resigned Friday as general manager of the Los Angeles Chargers professional football team, was hospitalized Saturday for treatment of a nervous condition.

Leahy's brother, suburban insurance agent Thomas Leahy, said the coach had suffered a "nervous breakdown brought on by worries over personal problems."

But Thomas Leahy stressed that his brother had entered Loretto General hospital here voluntarily under urging from relatives and friends.

"I've been close to Frank for the past year and know he's been terribly worried," Thomas Leahy said. "He's been worried about oil stock he sold to friends which hasn't turned out well. He feels responsible."

Leahy's brother said there were no problems connected with the Los Angeles Chargers connected with the breakdown.

Leahy, who compiled an amazing 107-13 record as head coach at Boston college and Notre Dame, was lured back into football last fall at a reputed \$50,000 a year.

Brazilian Star Wins 2nd Wimbledon Title

Wimbledon, England (UPI)—Maria Esther Bueno, the Brazilian brunette who holds the United States Women's tennis crown, won her second consecutive Wimbledon title Saturday by defeating Sandra Reynolds of South Africa, 8-6, 6-0.

Senorita Bueno's triumph was expected but Dennis Ralston, Bakersfield, Calif., and Mexico's Rafael Osuna completed one of the most surprising Wimbledon sweeps in years by winning the men's doubles crown with a 7-5, 6-3, 10-8 victory over British Davis Cuppers Mike Davies and Bob Wilson.

It was the first Wimbledon men's double final matching unseeded teams since World War II. Ralston, 17, the U.S. Junior champion, and Osuna, a student at the University of Southern California, reached the final by upsetting Australia's second seeded Rod Laver and Bob Mark in a three-hour match.

Senorita Bueno shared a second title when she and Darlene Hard, Montebello, Calif., easily won the women's doubles final, beating the Misses Reynolds and Renee Schuurman of South Africa, 6-4, 6-0. The Hard-Bueno team was top-seeded.
