

Police Break Up Newport Jazz Riot

Newport, R.I. (UPI)—A division of state police and three companies of Rhode Island national guardsmen moved into Newport Saturday night to break up a shouting, beer-can throwing crowd of 3,000 at the scene of the city's famed jazz festival.

The boisterous crowd milled around walled Freebody park where a sell-out crowd of 13,000 listened to jazz headliners on the third night of the festival.

Police said the riot was not directly caused by the festival though some of the crowd probably was disappointed at lack of tickets. The members of the audience were urged to remain inside the park until the disturbance outside was quelled.

Japanese Demand Kishi Resignation

Tokyo (UPI)—Tens of thousands of demonstrators marched on the Japanese Parliament (Diet) building Saturday demanding immediate resignation of Prime Minister Nobusuke Kishi, new elections and renunciation of the U.S.-Japan security treaty.

The demonstrators—carrying placards reading "Go home Americans" and "We want a socialist prime minister"—also milled outside the prime minister's official residence and the metropolitan police department headquarters.

The throng then spilled into the congested downtown area of Tokyo, blocking traffic for several hours in 84-degree weather.

There were no reports of violence.

Dominican Armed Forces Engaged In Maneuvers

Ciudad Trujillo, Dominican Republic (UPI)—The Dominican army, navy and air force Saturday were reported carrying out extensive military maneuvers, including the test-firing of "guided missiles." The republic officially was proclaimed in a state of national emergency.

President Gen. Hector B. Trujillo signed into law the proclamation passed by congress after he charged that Venezuela was preparing a movement against the Dominican Republic leading to war. Venezuela broke off diplomatic relations with the Dominican government earlier this year, accusing it of interference in Venezuelan internal affairs.

Tensions Heightened
The tensions were heightened recently by Venezuelan charges that the Trujillo regime was implicated in the attempted assassination of President Romulo Betancourt last week and an abortive short-lived revolt earlier.

Four ships carrying infantrymen and artillery sailed Friday from the Dominican naval base of Calderas for an undisclosed destination.

A naval spokesman said the movement was "routine maneuvers."

Today, army, navy and air force troops carrying weapons and other military equipment were seen in the streets of Ciudad Trujillo. The ministry of armed forces said the troop movement is part of "big military maneuvers" and urged the population not to be alarmed.

Dr. Moore Sees Washington Sights

Washington (UPI)—Dr. Barbara Moore hoofed her way around the tourist sights of Washington Saturday, then trudged back to the highway to continue her footsore 3,000-mile cross-country hike.

The Russian-born British woman was still setting a brisk pace as she headed for Baltimore and New York City on U. S. highway 1. She began her hike from San Francisco on April 30.

Many fellow sightseers here recognized the 56-year-old woman as she stopped in front of the White House, then swung up Pennsylvania ave. to the Capitol. A platoon of reporters and photographers accompanied her on her four-mile-an-hour walk through the city.

Miami (UPI)—National Airlines has announced it is cutting its Miami-to-Havana roundtrip flights from six to three weekly and its roundtrip Tampa-to-Havana flights from three to one a week because, "not as many people are going there."

Russia Accused of Torpedoing Talks

Washington (UPI)—The United States accused Russia Saturday of torpedoing the Geneva disarmament talks. It urged in a formal note that the Reds end their walkout and resume "serious negotiations."

"One of the notes was comparatively mild although it termed the walkout of the Soviet delegation and four Communist satellites "particularly surprising and regrettable." It said the Western allies remain ready to resume talks.

Esso Refinery in Cuba Paralyzed

Havana (UPI)—A government spokesman said Saturday the giant ESSO refinery has been totally paralyzed by lack of crude oil supplies since shortly after seizure of the American-owned plant by the regime of Premier Fidel Castro.

Castro seized the American-owned refinery of the Standard Oil Company of New Jersey and that of the Anglo-Dutch Shell Oil company Friday for refusing to refine Russian crude oil. The American-owned Texaco Oil company refinery was taken over earlier in the week on similar grounds.

The Texaco and Shell refineries were reported operating on schedule.
