Congress Has Little To Show as Result Of 6 Months' Work

Washington—UPI—After six months of work, the recessing Congress had little to show today in the way of final results.

Most of the big election-year issues which faced the lawmakers when they convened Jan. 6 will still be facing them when they resume work next month after the national political conventions.

The post-convention session will determine the fate of controversial legislation to launch new federal programs to help build public school classrooms and provide medical care for the aged.

It will determine how high the \$1 an hour minimum wage for 24 million workers is to be raised and to what extent the law is to be broadened to provide protection for additional workers.

Wheat Surplus Up Congress also must decide whether to make another election-year attempt to curb wheat surpluses and whether federal outlays for housing programs should be expanded.

Legislation dealing with all these subjects already has passed either Senate or House. School-aid legislation has won both Senate and House approval but the conservative-dominated House rules committee blocked negotiations to draft a compromise.

Federal Agencies Claimed Increasing Secrecy Tendencies

Washington—UPI—House security investigators here asserted that government agencies "from the White House down" have shown increasing tendency to deny Congress and the American people information about their activities.

The report of the special subcommittee condemned the practice of secrecy as "the refuge of incompetents."

They said secrecy practices have grown despite passage of a 1958 law designed to assure freedom of information about government activities.

'Executive Privilege' Since then, they charged, government agencies have relied increasingly on a claim of "executive privilege" to withhold information.

The allegations were contained in a report of the House Government Information subcommittee, summarizing five years of inquiry into government secrecy.

The report to the House said "a continuing battle must be waged to wipe out the unnecessary pockets of secrecy in administrative regulations, long-standing custom and bureaucratic attitudes."

"The power to withhold the facts of government is the power to destroy that government in a Democratic society," the report warned. "Such power is not to be lightly granted nor recklessly used."

The subcommittee said its five-year investigations show a "significant trend" towards claiming "executive privilege as justification, in spite of laws to the contrary, to deny Congress and the public any information which executive

The three big controversial issues resolved to date, are:—Enactment of a new civil rights law to provide for court-appointed referees to bolster Negro voting rights in the south. Administration forces and northern Democrats joined to push this through.

—Granting of a pay raise for 1,570,000 white collar federal employees, including postal workers. The Democratic-controlled Congress triumphed over the administration on this fight, enacting the law over the President's veto.

Like Won Fight—The launching of a big new Democratic program of federal aid for communities suffering from chronic unemployment. President Eisenhower won this fight. He vetoed the bill and Congress failed to override.

In addition, Congress granted the President's request to postpone for another year scheduled tax cuts. The Senate ratified the Japanese security treaty despite rioting in Tokyo that forced cancellation of Eisenhower's visit there, and Congress approved a constitutional amendment to give voteless district of Columbia residents a chance to vote in presidential elections. The last can't become effective until ratified by at least 38 states.

This claim, the report said, has been to refuse requests for farm crop support records, and to deny reporters a federal report on a local Kentucky jail.

'74 Complaints Studied' The subcommittee said it looked into 174 complaints of withheld information during its five-year operations. It listed these results: restrictions removed in 95 cases, restrictions continued in 68, and partial lifting of restrictions in the rest.

Rep. Clare E. Hoffman (R-Mich.) submitted a minority report contending that "this 170-year-old issue between the executive and the Congress will not be solved by declaration of congressional committees."

In a separate statement, Hoffman commended the defense department for its new program of "decreasing secret documents."

Hoffman gave special praise to assistant defense secretary Murray Snyder for "a record of solid achievement in making information available to the public."
