ALLERGY IN CHILDREN

Many children suffer greatly from food allergy which commonly is not recognized. It can produce a stuffy nose; it can cause much abdominal pain and flatulence, and I have seen it produce much mental slowing-up. This mental dullness comes often on Monday because, on Sunday, the child was given some food, such as chicken, pork, chocolate candy or nuts which he seldom got on the other days of the week.

Years ago, my associate Dr. Corwin Hinshaw and I asked 500 consecutively-seen patients what foods they had trouble with or just could not eat, and this is what we learned. First on the list was milk, which bothered about 25 per cent of people. So far as I know, few allergists paid any attention to this study because Hinshaw and I hadn't used skin tests. But at the Mayo Clinic, the allergists, and all of us, had found that skin tests are not of much value in revealing troublesome foods. They are of value mainly in finding the dusts and pollens that cause hay fever and asthma.

On the basis of skin tests, the allergists for years kept saying that wheat is the food to look out for. The point I have always made is that if I take a certain food away from a child or man, and if, in two days he is no better, he will be no better in another week or a month, and hence he had better go back and eat the food. I used to see unhappy thin people who had had most of the common foods taken away from them for months

Deputies Probe Ranch Burglary

Sheriff's deputies are investigating the burglary of a ranch near McKee bridge in the Applegate area last week, it was reported today.

Mrs. Richard F. Souza, 798 North Oregon st., Jacksonville, said someone broke the latch on the storage room door of the Leonard Wicksten ranch house and entered. The break-in was discovered by her sister and brother-in-law Saturday.

Kennedy's Wife Expecting Child

Washington—(AP)—Sen. John F. Kennedy (D-Mass.) and his wife are expecting their second child before the presidential election in November.

Friends of Kennedy, a front-runner for the Democratic presidential nomination, said that Mrs. Kennedy did not plan to attend the convention in Los Angeles because of her pregnancy.

But if the senator gets the nomination, she may fly to Los Angeles to hear him deliver his acceptance speech.

The Kennedys have one daughter, Caroline, 2 1/2 years old. She and her mother are expected to stay at Kennedy's summer home at Hyannis Port, Mass., during the convention.

Assaults Reported To County Deputies

Jackson county sheriff's deputies are investigating two assault cases which occurred Saturday.

Richard D. Kane, route 1, box 407A, Talent, told sheriff's deputies that Herbert Eugene Kelly, Talent, was assaulted early Saturday and his wallet containing about \$50 taken.

Kelly told deputies he met some men in a Medford bar early Saturday morning and rode with them to the Wagner Creek rd. There they beat him up, took his wallet and left him on the road, he said.

Later that day, Lester Igo, route 4, box 424E, Medford, told deputies he was assaulted on his orchard land on South Columbus ave. Saturday. His glasses were broken when he was hit on the nose, and a recently broken rib was broken again, he said.

Igo said he went to the orchard late Saturday afternoon and found a group of youngsters had changed the irrigation system around, and were floating boats in the ditches, deputies said. Igo said he told the youngsters to leave. The father of one of them protested to Igo, then punched him on the nose, deputies were told.

Two Escape in Light Plane Crash

Bellingham—(AP)—A minister and his passenger escaped serious injury when the light plane in which they were riding crashed into the water on Point White Horn at the end of Birch Bay in northern Whatcom county Monday night.

Rev. Allen Wood and Howard Mehr, both Bellingham, suffered only cuts and bruises when the plane's engine conked out and the aircraft slammed into the water. The men had to wade to shore.

They were picked up by a small boat following the crash. Damage to the aircraft was estimated at \$1,000.

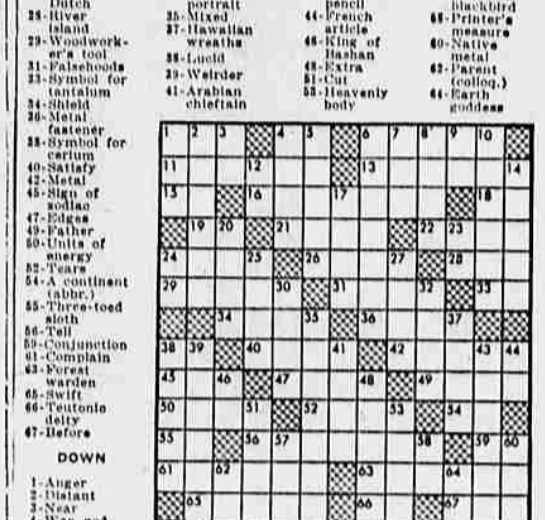
