## Chamber Board To Study New Law

The Medford Chamber of Commerce directors decided Thursday to study the new Oregon community college law, and its potential effect on the local tax base.

Chamber Secretary Don McNeil, who discussed the law recently with members of the Oregon Tax Research board, said the tax district for the rumored community college in Coos Bay might extend into parts of Jackson county.

Other business included a report that the Coos Bay Pirates will be in Medford July 30 to promote the Coos Bay trade fair scheduled for late August. They will invite local manufacturing firms to exhibit in the fair, he said.

Considerable discussion centered around the Medford airport's lighting, parking and preparation for jet service.

While the discussion was not critical of present development plans, the board felt that the chamber's enlarged aviation committee should study the problem.

Architect Bob Keeney reported that plans for the new chamber building are complete. Bids will be called from contractors who are members of the chamber.

## Ike Plans Another Session of Golf

Newport, R.I.—President Eisenhower, apparently shedding most of his national and international cares for the time being, today planned another round of golf on the country club course in this seaside resort city where he and the First Lady are spending their summer vacation.

The President was expected to tee off for another tour of the course on which he shot a respectable round in the mid-80s shortly after arriving from Washington late Thursday afternoon.

But all was not relaxation. Presidential Press Secretary James C. Hagerly said Eisenhower would attend to necessary White House business after a check with Washington on matters requiring his attention. About 130 bills approved by the recent session of Congress still await presidential action.

## 15 Congressmen Publicly Endorse Equal Services

Washington—The "sit-in" movements by students and others seeking equal service regardless of race in eating places located in areas where those facilities are still segregated has been endorsed publicly by 15 members of Congress.

The Congressmen said they were "particularly aware that segregation still exists in the Washington area where we live most of the year..."

"We believe," read the public statement released for the group by Rep. Charles O. Porter (D-Ore), "that the opening of lunch counters and restaurants to all persons regardless of race, throughout the nation, is long overdue. We hope that business and other community leaders will work with us and other Americans to this end. We call their attention to the orderly and successful desegregation of eating places and other public facilities in the District of Columbia a decade ago. We applaud developments in Virginia."

**Time Prevents**

The Representatives commended the students for their "determinedly orderly and legal action." Porter said a lack of time had prevented obtaining more signatures. The signers included 14 Democrats and one Republican.

## Paint Thinner Delays Pool Job

A mix-up in the delivery of paint thinner delayed the painting of the Jackson park swimming pool yesterday, according to Recreation Supervisor Ken Lyons.

Lyons said the thinner, which was ordered from Portland, was mistakenly delivered to Coos Bay instead of Medford. The thinner was to be delivered yesterday afternoon, he said.

The pool will not be open until Wednesday, at the earliest, Lyons said, to give the paint the proper amount of time to dry.

Painting of the pool is being done, he pointed out, to give the pool a smoother surface. The city has received numerous complaints about children scraping their feet on the bottom and sides of the plaster finished pool.

Cost of the painting will be about \$500, Lyons said. The second session of swimming instruction classes, which were scheduled to start at Jackson pool July 11, have been cancelled and will be rescheduled at a later date, he said.
